#### KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION



Registration for Kindergarten, for September 2018, will begin Monday Feb. 5th. Parents are welcome to register anytime on or after this date. We currently have 4 classes of JK/SK students that attend school every day. All of our classes include a teacher and a Regis-

tered Early Childhood Educator and can have a maximum of 30 children. The Ministry of Education defines the parameters for enrolment in these classes and our enrolment predicts how many classes we have.

Students registering for Junior Kindergarten must have their 4th birthday prior to December 31, 2018. All schools in the Hamilton Wentworth District School Board offer Full day Kindergarten. If you have neighbours or friends in our catchment area, please invite them to come into the school any day between 9:30-3:30 p.m. to register. Kindergarten Orientation session will be held on Wednesday, May 2nd between 4:00-5:00pm in the library. This session is for parents/guardians only. On May 10th, please bring your children between 5:00-5:30pm to visit our kindergarten classrooms before Allan Greenleaf School's Open House. We look forward to meeting you and your little ones.

#### REPORT CARDS

First term report cards will be distributed on February 13, 2018. Students should understand the marks on their report card and how they can improve them through

#### ICY CONDITIONS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY



A reminder to please be careful when you are walking on school property. Although we have contractors who clear and salt our parking lots and sidewalks there is always the risk of slippery patches. Also, the back

playground is not cleared or salted so this area requires even greater care to ensure safety. When the school feels conditions on the back playground are not safe, we will have students stay indoors for recess.

#### WINTER WEATHER



A reminder to all that Winter is upon us. Parents, please ensure your child(ren) are dressed appro-

priately for the weather. Students, please wear the warm clothes that you bring to school. Snow pants, hats, mittens and scarves are essential. Students are outside for a total of 40 minutes each day for fresh air and exercise. If dressed inappropriately, this can be uncomfortable. Please be aware that students cannot remain in the school when not dressed for the weather because they are not supervised. Principals can use their judgment in determining whether or not students remain inside during recess given the weather conditions. However, the City of Hamilton's Public Health and Community Services Department recommends individuals stay indoors when the temperature drops below minus 15 degrees Celsius without wind chill.

#### **PARKING & IDLING CARS**



Our parents and community have responded so well to our request to honour the NO STOPPING area in the front of the school this year. However, with the winter weather we are noticing an increase in people stopping their cars in this area to drop students off. Please remember to

pull over before or after the NO STOPPING zone to ensure the safety of all of our students.

In addition, we ask that parents not park in the areas designated for staff. This is especially important in the area by our Kindergarten entrance as regularly parents with young children are walking through this section.

#### **SALTING OF SCHOOL**

Staff from Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board will clear, salt and/or sand the following areas:



- The walkways from the City sidewalk to the school
- The school steps and portable steps
- Walkways to the portables
- Ramps to schools and portables
- An area outside of entrances and Fire Exit Doors
- Fire Exit stairs and ramps

When there is an accumulation of 5 cm of snow, parking lots and sidewalks are plowed by approved contractors arranged through Facilities Management. General salting and sanding of the parking lot is also done by contracted staff prior to the commencement of the school day when deemed necessary by the Facility Management staff. Head Caretakers may salt or sand isolated areas on the parking lot on an as needed basis.

Playgrounds will not be plowed or otherwise cleared. Head Caretakers will check the condition of the grounds early in the morning and during the school day to sand and/or salt isolated slippery areas that may occur due to changing temperature.

Students should take extra caution when walking onto and leaving from school grounds. Caution must also be taken when playing on school grounds when conditions are slippery.

Principals may decide, dependent on weather and playground conditions, to have indoor recess and lunch/nutrition breaks.
