PRINCIPALS MESSAGE

1. Administrative Changes

2. Staffing Information

The staffing process for the Board will continue into the summer months. Round Two of teacher postings and interviews are taking place over the next couple of weeks. That is followed by teacher placements by a Board committee and if schools have vacancies after that, they will be permitted to hire. Over the summer, staff could change due to personal moves, resignations, retirements, illness, promotions, system staffing needs or leaves of absence. Tentative teacher assignments will be indicated when reports go home.

3. **EQAO**

As we move into June, we are "wrapping up" this assessment. Our students "gave it, a good go..." and we are confident they will represent our school well.

Although we tend to play down the Ministry's and media's importance and attention to this testing, it does provide a snapshot of student performance standards at that time of writing it. The results of this assessment provides some indication of how well our students have grasped the provincial expectations and it will assist our staff to uncover what we do well and what areas require attention. Over the years, this process has assisted in developing consistency and continuity in program content, instruction, assignments and assessment. Results from the EQAO testing will be released in autumn.

COURTESY BUS TRANSPORTATION

All students who are eligible for Transportation to and from

school will be notified in writing by the bus company during the summer. If your child does not receive information about drop off and pick-up, they are not permitted to ride the bus. The Hamilton



Wentworth District School Board spends much more money on student transportation than they receive from the Ministry of Education and thus the School Board aims to have the buses that they run full to capacity with eligible students. Each year there are some extra seats available on our buses. The number of seats varies each year and cannot be predicted prior to September. Parents can come into the office in September to get a form to request Courtesy Transportation. If and when we determine that we have extra seats available for Courtesy Transportation we will allocate the seats to the students who live the furthest from the school. Please know that Courtesy Transportation is not guaranteed from one year to the next. Each year we process the requests based on the number of seats available in that year. Also note: if your child is in Kindergarten this year and qualified for transportation but is in grade 1 in September, they may no longer qualify for transportation. The distance from school to qualify for transportation changes at grade 1 and again in the later years. The distance from school to qualify for transportation increases as the age of your child increases. To view the HWDSB Transportation Policy please refer to the Board website.

HWDSB HEAT EVENT

With the warmer weather now approaching, Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board (HWDSB) would like to make you aware of our procedures during a heat event.



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The City of Hamilton Public Health department monitors weather forecasts closely and notifies the media and community partners of a heat event. A heat event occurs when the forecast calls for one or more days with a 40 or higher humidex reading.

Once HWDSB has been notified of a heat event, information will be posted on our website and the following precautionary steps will be taken for students:

-limit physical outdoor activities

- -ensure access to water
- -close drapes and blinds -move students through cooler areas of the school
- -monitor students for symptoms of heat stress

DRESS CODE

Now that the weather is warmer, please support your child in choosing appropriate clothing to stay cool. Below is the dress code expectations.

Students who dress appropriately appear self-disciplined, well-organized and re-

spectful. Students, staff and other school personnel are required to wear clothing that is appropriate and suitable for the school environment and setting.

The following are the expectations regarding dress code at Greenleaf School:

Students, staff and other school personnel will not wear:

- Clothing or jewelry that bears suggestive or objectionable pictures, logos, words, symbols, any offensive, violent or racist comments or messages
- Haltertops, tube tops, muscle shirts, tops with low cut necklines, spaghetti straps or tops that expose midriff sections or under-garments; shirt straps will be a minimum width of 2 fingers
- Pants, shorts or skirts which expose undergarments, or that are worn low on the hips. Shorts and skirts must be at least as long as the end of a student's fingers when their arm is fully extended at their side
- Jewelry that could compromise the safety of others

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 Students dressed inappropriately will, at the least, be required to cover up.

Information regarding placement and teacher will be communicated on the Report Card going home on June 25th. Our hope is that by doing this, first day of school anxiety may be reduced as chil-

dren will have an opportunity to prepare over the summer. Our staff spends a tremendous amount of time and energy creating class lists. Staff teams collaborate to create these lists. They review social, emotional and academic development. In addition, they consider the number of males and females, balancing academic performance and leadership skills, which students need to be together, and who needs to be separated. Teachers differentiate instruction on a daily basis. As all parents were given an opportunity to have input as indicated in previous newsletters. Requests to have students move classes will not be granted.

Kindergarten students will receive a postcard in the mail indicating their class assignment and the date and time of the JK or new SK meeting on September 4. With the staggered entry, new JK students will have one hour visits on Tuesday, September 4th. **All Junior and Senior Kindergarten students start on Wednesday September 5, 2018**.
