2. Treasury Report

10. Principal's Report

- From Dr Bowler: Go Girls initiative previously only intended for girls grades 6-8, however it has been extended to invite grade 5 girls to take part this year
 - explores self esteem, other issues facing girls of this age group
 - All grade 5 girls eligible to participate
 - partnership with Big Brothers/Big Sisters
 - Dr Bowler requested volunteer assistance.
- From Mr Maliphant: school enrollment at 418 students as of today
- September reorganization:
 - French Grade 1 students: enrollment over maximum by 12 students will need to shuffle classes to accommodate.
 - French Grade 2 classes below maximum
 - English Grade 1 only 1 or 2 students may be moved
 - numbers will be finalized by 29 Sept,

11. Banana Free School

- Must the entire school be banana-free?
 - Yes too much potential for affected staff member to come into contact because her duties take her to all areas of the school
 - Info shared on facebook regarding this situation: Despite what many people may believe, the banana allergy for this person is in fact an airborne issue. Walking past bananas alone can cause her throat to start swelling, and she has had episodes in grocery stores and restaurants. Any banana product (banana oil included) consumed within 1 1/2 - 2 hours prior to contact with her could lead to a reaction. As such, it is important that the people in that specific classroom not consume any banana product prior to coming to school, and that no banana products come into the school. Children in other classrooms can consume banana products prior to school since her likelihood of coming into contact with that person is small and everyone can eat bananas after school and on weekends. There are a number of products that bananas/banana oils can be in that you might not think of including yogurt, apple sauce, soap, shampoo and lip balms. She does NOT have any issue with anything other than bananas so there is no latex, avocado etc issue at play. Plus, she CAN eat plantains.
