Safe Schools

Parents are reminded that if you're coming to the school you must stop at the office and speak to one of our Office Administrators. Any parents or visitors within the school must wear a visitor badge from the office. Please do not go up the stairs or to a classroom without a badge. If you have communication for the teacher, please write it in the agenda. At entry time, the teacher needs to have full attention on the students as instruction time begins at 8:50 AM. This procedure must be followed other than in very special arrangements where principal permission has been given. For safety reasons, we need to know who is in the school at all times. When parents are in the hall this becomes commonplace so in the event a stranger ever came into the school this may not be noticeable right away. Remember, to people who do not know you, you are a stranger. Thank you for your support in this matter.

Dental Screening

Dental screening will take place for JK/SK and Grade 2 students on Friday, January 12^{th.} Letters will be sent home to all AMC students in the event that parents would like their child screened, who are not in the grades mentioned above.

<u>Anaphylaxis</u>

A reminder that we have a number of students with severe and life-threatening nut allergies. We need everyone to ensure that no nuts or products containing nuts, are sent to school. "Wow Butter" is a product that is permitted. It is a peanut butter substitute that does not contain nuts or nut products. If your child is bringing this, please use a container and attach the "wow butter" labels to the container so there is no question of the contents.

Tobacco Free Schools

HWDSB has developed the Tobacco-Free Schools Protocol jointly with the City of Hamilton Public Health Services, designed to reflect the Smoke-Free Ontario Act. Parents/Guardians are reminded that it is illegal to smoke on school property. School property begins at the City sidewalks and fenced areas, inward to and including the school building. School staff and visitors are also reminded of this protocol.

Winter Weather



Benefits of outdoor play

Time spent outdoors is an integral part of the school day. There are great benefits when children experience **fresh air, exercise and time spent time outside**. Outdoor play is also a break from the structure of the classroom.

Preparing for the outdoors

It's important that children come to school **prepared for the cold.** This means boots, mittens/gloves, hats and even extra mittens and socks in case they are needed.

When is it too cold for outdoor play?

Principals decide whether to send students outside for recess. HWDSB asks Principals to follow the City of Hamilton guideline that we stay inside when it's at or **below -15C, or -20C with wind chill.** below -15C, or -20C with wind chill

Snow-clearing at HWDSB Schools

A responsibility shared by Board staff, contractors and the City of Hamilton

HWDSB Staff

Clear, salt and/or sand ...

- walkways from the city sidewalk to the school
- school steps and portable steps
- walkways to the portables
- ramps to schools and portables
- area outside entrances and Fire Exit Doors
- Fire Exit stairs & ramps

HWDSB Contactors

After 5cm+ of snow, will...

- Plow parking lots and sidewalks when HWDSB Facilities staff deem it necessary
- Salt and sand the parking lot before school starts
- If required, Head Caretakers may also salt or sand parts of the parking lot

City of Hamilton

Responsible for clearing...

- Snow and ice from sidewalks directly in front of schools, a top priority for the City.
- Note: It may take up to 24 hours after a snowfall for sidewalks to be cleared.

What about playgrounds?

Playgrounds *are not* plowed or cleared. Head Caretakers inspect playgrounds and sand and/or salt areas made slippery by changing temperatures.

Students, take extra caution when walking or playing on school property that may be slippery. Principals concerned about weather or playground conditions may hold indoor recesses and lunch/nutrition breaks.



Report Cards / Communication of Learning

Understanding your child's report card Grades 1-5

Grade 1-5 students are assessed on a letter grade system.

| "B" or Level 3 | This is the provincial standard. Students achieving at this high level of achievement can be confident of being prepared for work in subsequent grades . They are able demonstrate this when working independently, with considerable effectiveness and giving complete explanations. | |
|----------------|---|--|
| "C" or Level 2 | This indicates that they are <i>approaching</i> the provincial standard. They are "almost there" demonstrated some or the required skills or knowledge. | |
| "D" or Level 1 | This indicates that students are only beginning to demonstrate a skill or do so in a limited way. | |
| "A" or Level 4 | Students achieving at this level are surpassing the provincial standard, working with a high degree of effectiveness, applying the concepts in a sophisticated way | |
