#### Class Placements 2018/2019

With a new school year approaching, many parents wonder who their child's teacher will be for next school year. This planning process for organizing classes is now underway. When creating classes, teachers meet with each other and school administration to discuss the needs of each student. Some of the issues discussed are:

- · Balance of ability, interests, and talents
- · Learning styles of students
- · Resources and remedial needs, enrichment needs
- · Balance of males/females
- Teaching styles of teachers
- · Diversity
- · Students to be kept together or separated because of the positive/negative influence of each other's learning.

We appreciate your trust in our professional judgement in balancing the considerations mentioned above. The final decision for class placements is the responsibility of the principal. ## Riding Bikes & Walking to School



With the arrival of nicer weather, parents may choose to allow their children to walk or ride a bike to and from the school. If this is the case, the office MUST have <u>a note</u> on file stating that the child has parent's permission and will be walking/biking instead of taking the bus.

Parents are assuming responsibility for their children when they choose this option. A reminder that it's the law for children to be wearing helmets when riding bikes.

## **Balaclava Book Fair**



The Scholastic Book Fair is coming to the Balaclava Library the first week of May.

Kindergarten to Grade 5 classes will be brought down during class time on Monday, April 30th or Tuesday, May 1st to view the Book Fair and create their wish lists to bring home and share with their parents.

Grade 6-8 students will be able to visit the Book Fair during first Nutrition Break on Monday, April 30th.

On Thursday May 3rd during the indoor part of first and second Nutrition Break students will be able to visit the Book Fair to purchase the items they would like. The Book Fair will also be open during the Open House if parents wish to visit the Book Fair with their children and be with their children when they make their purchases.

### Health and Safety During a Heat Event

A local heat event occurs when the forecast calls for one or more days with a 40 or higher humidex reading. The City of Hamilton Public Health Department monitors weather forecasts closely and notifies the media and community partners of a heat event.

Once HWDSB has been notified of a heat event, information will be posted on the board's website and the following pre-cautionary steps will be taken for students:

- ⇒ Limit physical outdoor activities
- ⇒ Ensure access to water
- ⇒ Close drapes and blinds
- ⇒ Move pupils through cooler areas of the room
- ⇒ Monitor students for symptoms of heat stress

#### **Dress Code**

As we see a return to nice weather, I would like to remind all community members of the Appropriate Dress Policy. Students, staff and other school personnel are required to wear clothing that is appropriate and suitable for the school environment and setting.

- ⇒ Pants/shorts/skirts/etc. worn so that the undergarments or backside are covered ("the top of the bottoms will meet the bottom of the tops.")
- $\Rightarrow$  Shorts/skirts should be at least as long as the fingers of an outstretched hand.
- ⇒ Shirts spaghetti straps, halter tops, tube tops, muscle shirts, low necklines, and tops that expose midriff sections are not permitted
- Clothing/Jewellery must be appropriate for school by being free of inappropriate or offensive words, messages, or pictures of a racist/sexist, negative ethnic, objectionable, suggestive, or violent message, or which advertise alcohol or drugs.

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If a student's clothing is deemed inappropriate he/she will be asked to change. Parents may be called to provide proper clothes. We appreciate your cooperation in regards to this policy.






## **Fun Fair Plant Sale**




Once upon a 'thyme'... Balaclava School held a Fun Fair! At the Fun Fair there will be a *Plant Sale!* Students in
