With a new school year approaching, many parents wonder who their child's teacher will be for next school year. This planning process for organizing classes is now underway. Textbooks & Library Books



Health and Safety During a Heat Event

A local heat event occurs when the forecast calls for one or more days with a 40 or higher humidex reading. The City of Hamilton Public Health Department monitors weather forecasts closely and notifies the media and community partners of a heat event.

Once HWDSB has been notified of a heat event, information will be posted on the board's website and the following pre-cautionary steps will be taken for students:



- ⇒ Ensure access to water
- ⇒ Close drapes and blinds
- ⇒ Move pupils through cooler areas of the room
- ⇒ Monitor students for symptoms of heat stress

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Dress Code

As we see a return to nice weather, I would like to remind all community members of the Appropriate Dress Policy. Students, staff and other school personnel are required to wear clothing that is appropriate and suitable for the school environment and setting.

- ⇒ Pants/shorts/skirts/etc. worn so that the undergarments or backside are covered ("the top of the bottoms will meet the bottom of the tops.")
- ⇒ Shorts/skirts should be at least as long as the fingers of an outstretched hand.
- ⇒ Shirts spaghetti straps, halter tops, tube tops, muscle shirts, low necklines, and tops that expose midriff sections are not permitted
- ⇒ Clothing/Jewelry must be appropriate for school by being free of inappropriate or offensive words, messages, or pictures of a racist/sexist, negative ethnic, objectionable, suggestive, or violent message, or which advertise alcohol or drugs.

If a student's clothing is deemed inappropriate he/she will be asked to change. Parents may be called to provide proper clothes. We appreciate your cooperation in regards to this policy.
