- At the November 26, 2018, Board meeting, Trustees approved:
that Bellmore School be temporarily changed to a K-6 school until a permanent solution can be found to solve the accommodation pressures.
- The report states that the new school on the Summit Park site will be assisting with the accommodation pressures at Bellmore. Grades 7-8 students from Bellmore will be attending this new school until a permanent solution is provided for Binbrook.
- At the December 17, 2018, Board meeting, Trustees approved:
Be it resolved; that staff apply the boundary review policy to the temporary accommodation strategy at Bellmore Elementary (and to include other potential impacted schools) and report back to trustees no later than March 2019.

Purpose of a Boundary Review:

Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board (HWDSB) believes in optimizing and ensuring the effective and efficient use of all facilities to support student achievement.

Policy Outlines Steps to be undertaken by staff:

Create the boundary review advisory panel

Conduct a community consultation

Review the data from the community consultation

Present feedback to Board

- Family of Schools Superintendent(s)
- Planning & Accommodation Staff
- Trustees of affected schools
- Principals of affected schools
- Up to two School Council Representatives from affected schools

Boundary Review Procedure 2.1

The mandate of the Boundary Review Advisory Panel is to advise the Superintendent of Student Achievement of possible options after reviewing the guiding principles, receiving community input and providing local expertise.

Boundary Review Policy 2.1

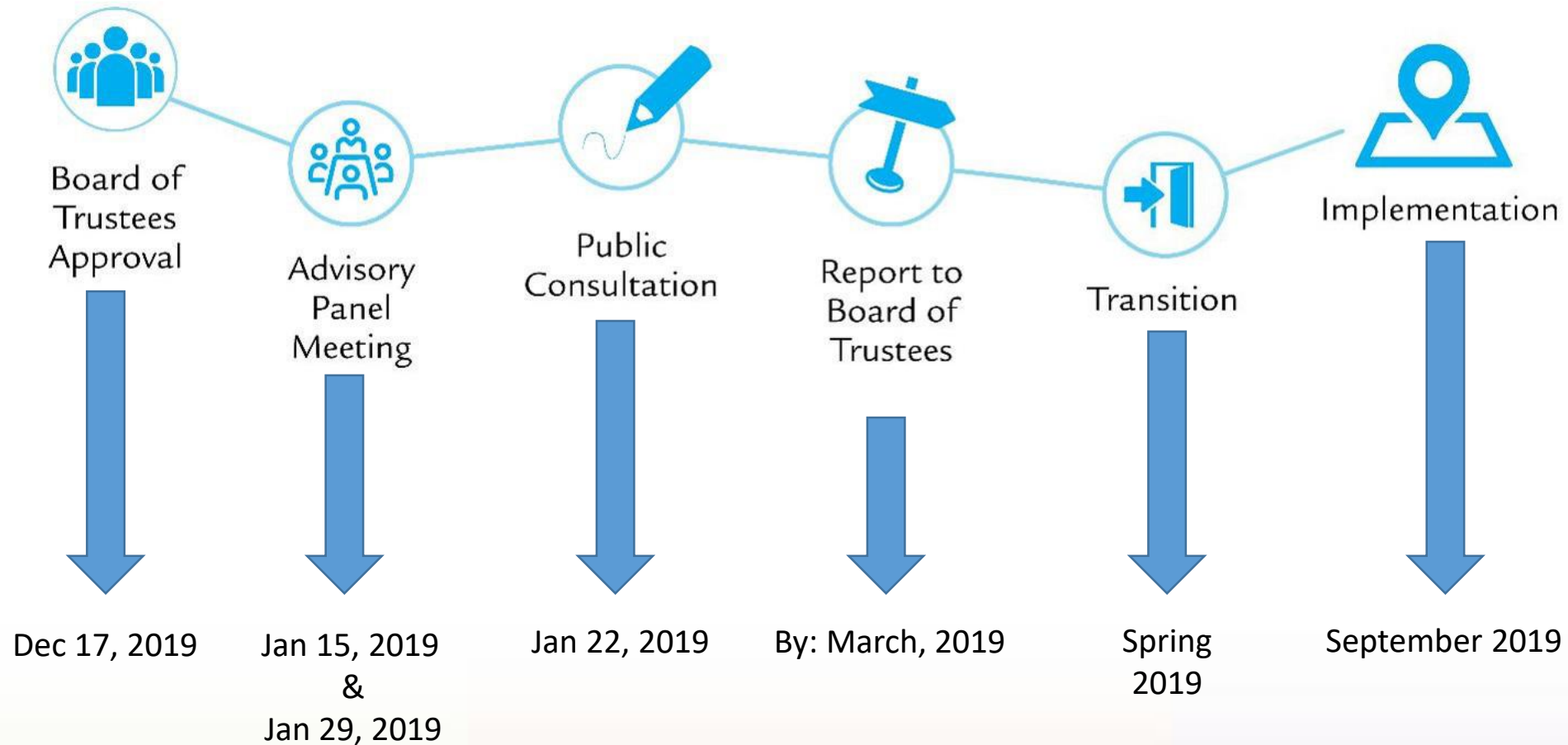
- Address the short and long-term accommodation requirements of the impacted communities in a timely manner;
- Be mindful of the best and most prudent use of all resources available to HWDSB
- Adhere to the guiding principles as defined in the Long- Term Facilities Master Plan including optimal school capacity, grade organization, transportation, facility requirements, site size and the balance between French Immersion and English track students in dual track schools
- Consult with the impacted school communities to gain further insight into the boundary recommendation(s).
- Where possible, attempt to create more socio-economically diverse school communities.
- Be mindful of the distance to the nearest school and the ability for students to safely travel to school.

Boundary Review Policy 2.1

The Advisory Panel will meet a minimum of once before and a minimum of once after the public meeting to review the following:

- a) Rationale for change
- b) Preferred option(s)
- c) Enrolment & facility utilization impacts
- d) Financial impacts
- e) Transportation impacts
- f) Community consultation
- g) Implementation considerations

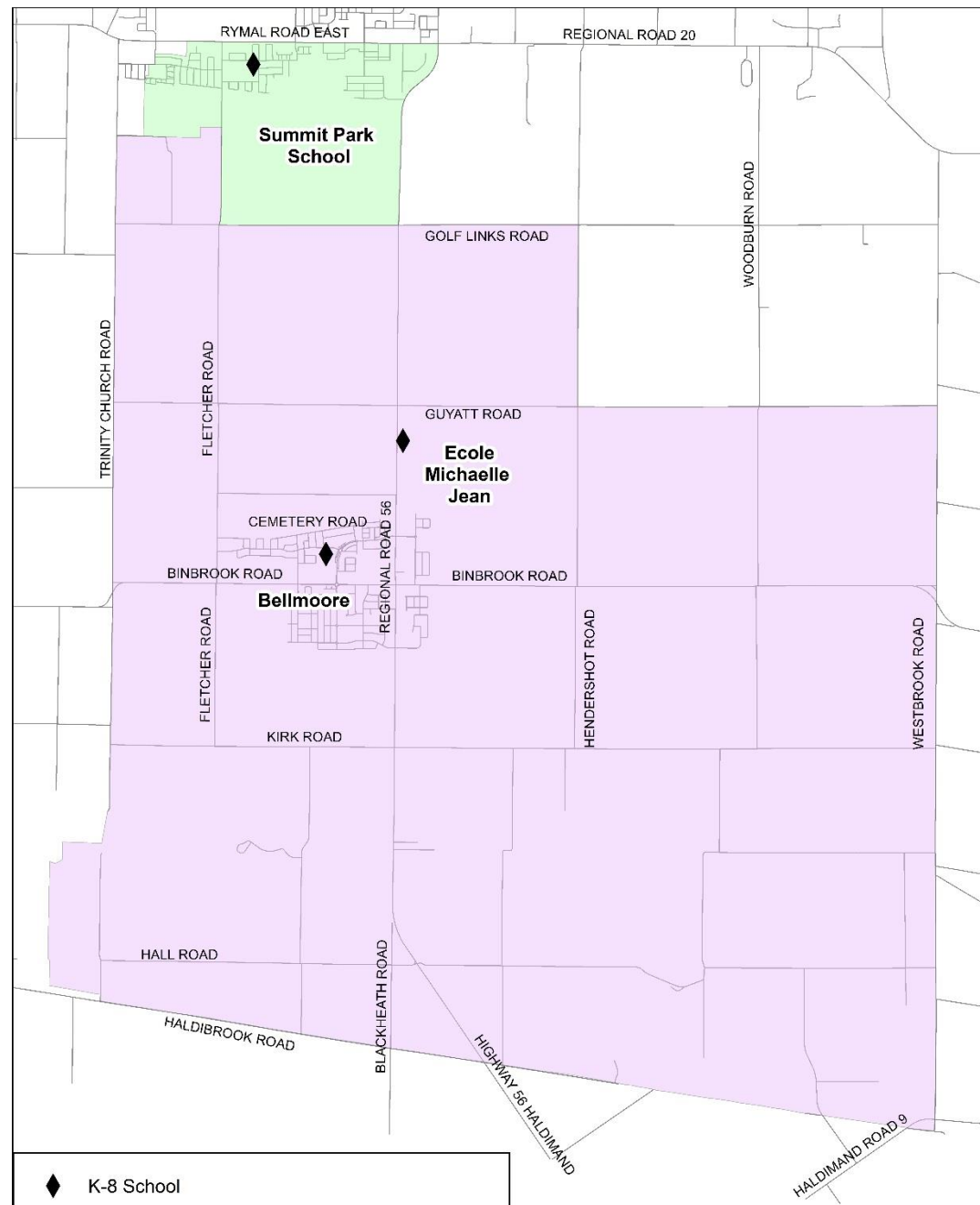
Boundary Review Policy 2.1



- Providing the best possible programming for students
- Address enrolment pressures at Bellmoore
- Without significant capital expenditures and extended timelines, Bellmoore cannot accommodate additional portables

- Improve student access to specialized spaces (Visual Art Room, Gym, Library and Music Room)
- Reduce enrolment at Bellmoore in 2019 to address accommodation pressure issues (parking, street traffic, student drop-off/pickup, access to washrooms)
- Create a more balanced and predictable enrolment between Bellmoore and the New School on the Summit Park Site
- Implement a strategy which is clear and concise for students, parents, staff and community

Bellmoore & New Summit Park School Current Enrolment and Boundaries

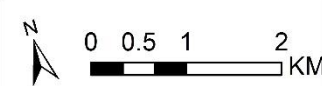

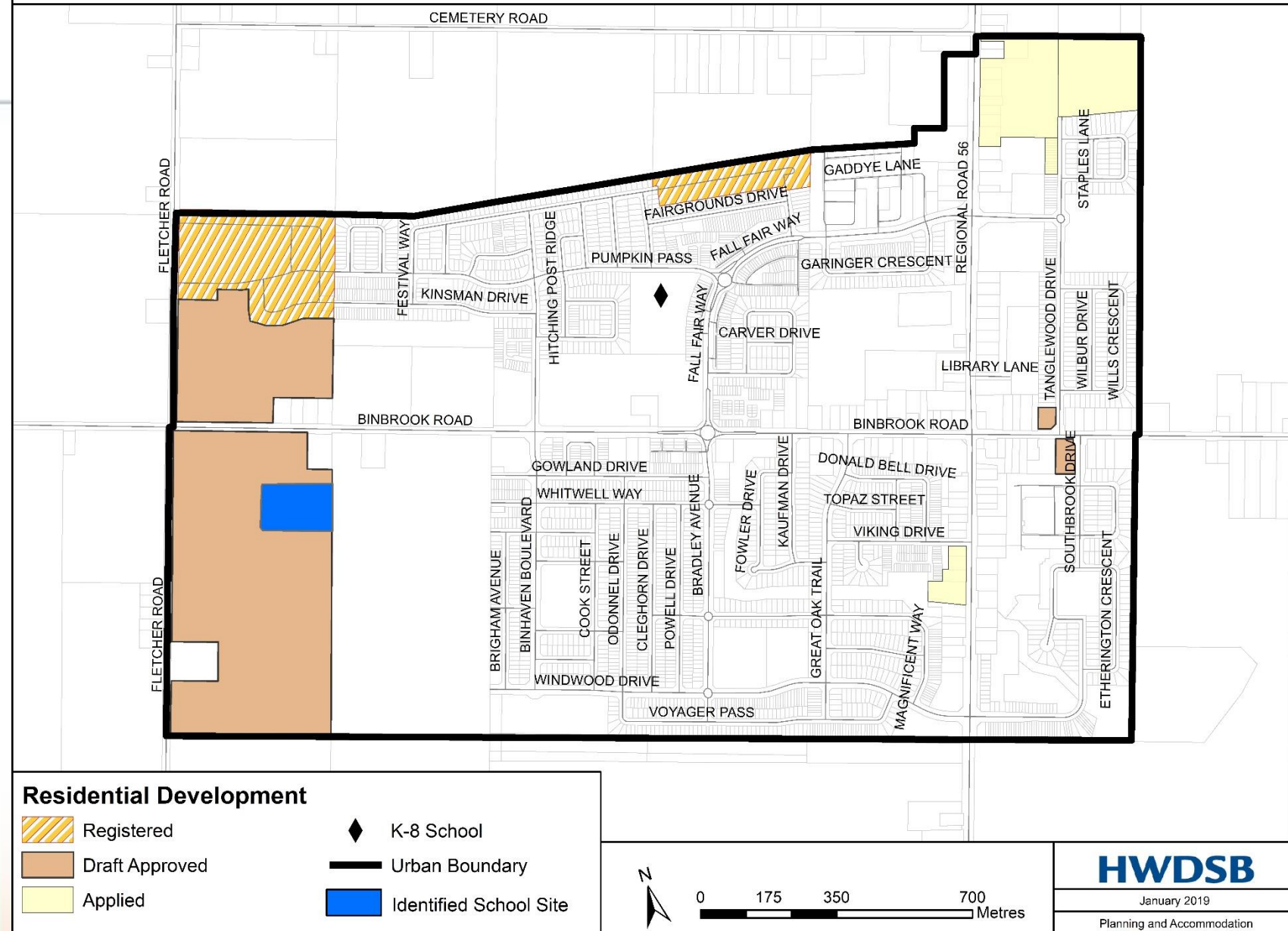

- OTG: On-the-ground capacity - represents number of students the permanent structure of a school can accommodate based on Ministry of Education instructional space loading. Depending on programs and grade structure facilities can typically accommodate more students than its OTG

HWDSB

- Current owner of land is working with the City of Hamilton to complete the studies and reports required to move forward with developing the land.
- HWDSB will purchase land from owner at first available opportunity – projected 2021
- HWDSB will apply to the Ministry of Education at the first available opportunity for funding to construct the school
- If funding and land is acquired by end of 2021 the school could be constructed by 2023

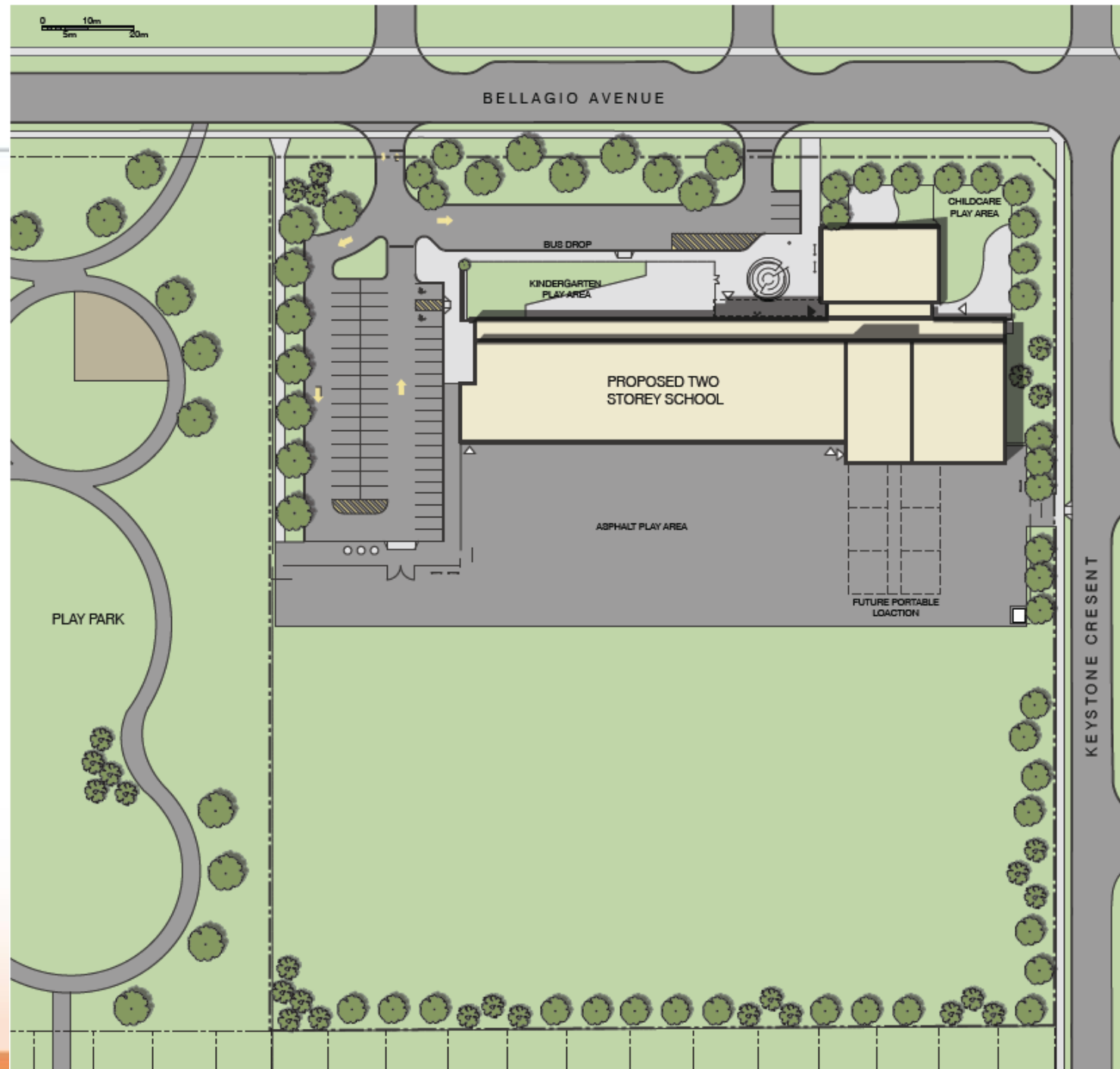

Temporary Accommodation Strategies

New Capital - Options

Multiple storey or additional portables are possible but the municipal service requirements (electrical, washrooms, fire safety) for additional students are the barriers to adding portables. Construction timelines and funding are additional barriers to the proposed temporary solution for September 2019.

To add more portables at Bellmoore, we would need to address:

- Washroom counts (currently maxed out female washroom count)
- Parking space counts
- Portable access to fire hydrants (fire code)
- Setbacks from property line & berms on sides of property
- Bus pickup and drop off
- Childcare addition
- Sightlines/supervision due to portables
- Access to asphalt play area

- Currently, there are no funding opportunities available through the Ministry of Education for new capital.
- If funding were available to design and build an addition at Bellmoore could not be completed for September 2019.
- This option would still require a temporary accommodation solution prior to proposed addition being complete.

- Due to continued growth of the French Immersion enrolment, the facility does not have space to accommodate additional students
- Previously Michaelle Jean has been considered to be used to alleviate accommodation pressure at Bellmoore for a 1-year period
- Trustees approved that effective September 2012, a single track French Immersion program begin in grade 1 at the current Bellmoore School site on Highway 56 (renamed Ecole Michaelle Jean)

Capping Bellmoore's Enrolment - Options

Capping JK & No New SK-8 Students Enrol at Bellmoore

- The following scenario depicts capping the JK enrolment at 100 students per year and no new students would be enrolled at Bellmoore in grades SK-8.
- All projected JK students beyond 100 and new SK-8 students from housing development and housing sales attend New School on the Summit Park Site.

Information to consider for this option:

- This scenario would allow JK students with and without siblings to enter Bellmoore but would require new families with students in grades SK-8 to attend Summit Park site. This could potentially separate new Binbrook families with students in JK and older grades
- This option would require an application and random selection process for JK entry at Bellmoore
- This option would also require the Board to clearly define what a “new student” means. New to Board? New to neighbourhood?

Information to consider for this option:

- Bellmoore enrolment and need for portables projected to decline
- Projected to require 10 portables at Bellmoore by 2023
- Enrolment at Summit Park site and need for portables projected to increase
- Projected to require 19 portables at Summit Park site by 2023

HWDSB Allowing Only Siblings to Attend Bellmoore

- The following scenario depicts only allowing students with siblings to enter JK Bellmoore starting in 2019.
- Based on the past three years of enrolment history at Bellmoore, on average approximately 39% of JK-3 students have an older sibling at Bellmoore.
- The 39% average has been applied to the incoming JK enrolment.
- All projected new students from housing development and housing resale attend New School on the Summit Park Site.

The 2019 to 2023 Bellmoore JK enrolment numbers are straight lined based on the 39% average sibling average. This assumes that the existing housing in Bellmoore will continue to yield approximately 130 JK students but only 39% of students will attend Bellmoore. Over time the percentage of students with an older sibling in Bellmoore may decrease, reducing Bellmoore's enrolment further and in turn increasing the new school on the Summit Park site more rapidly.

- Projected to require 27 portables at Summit Park site by 2023

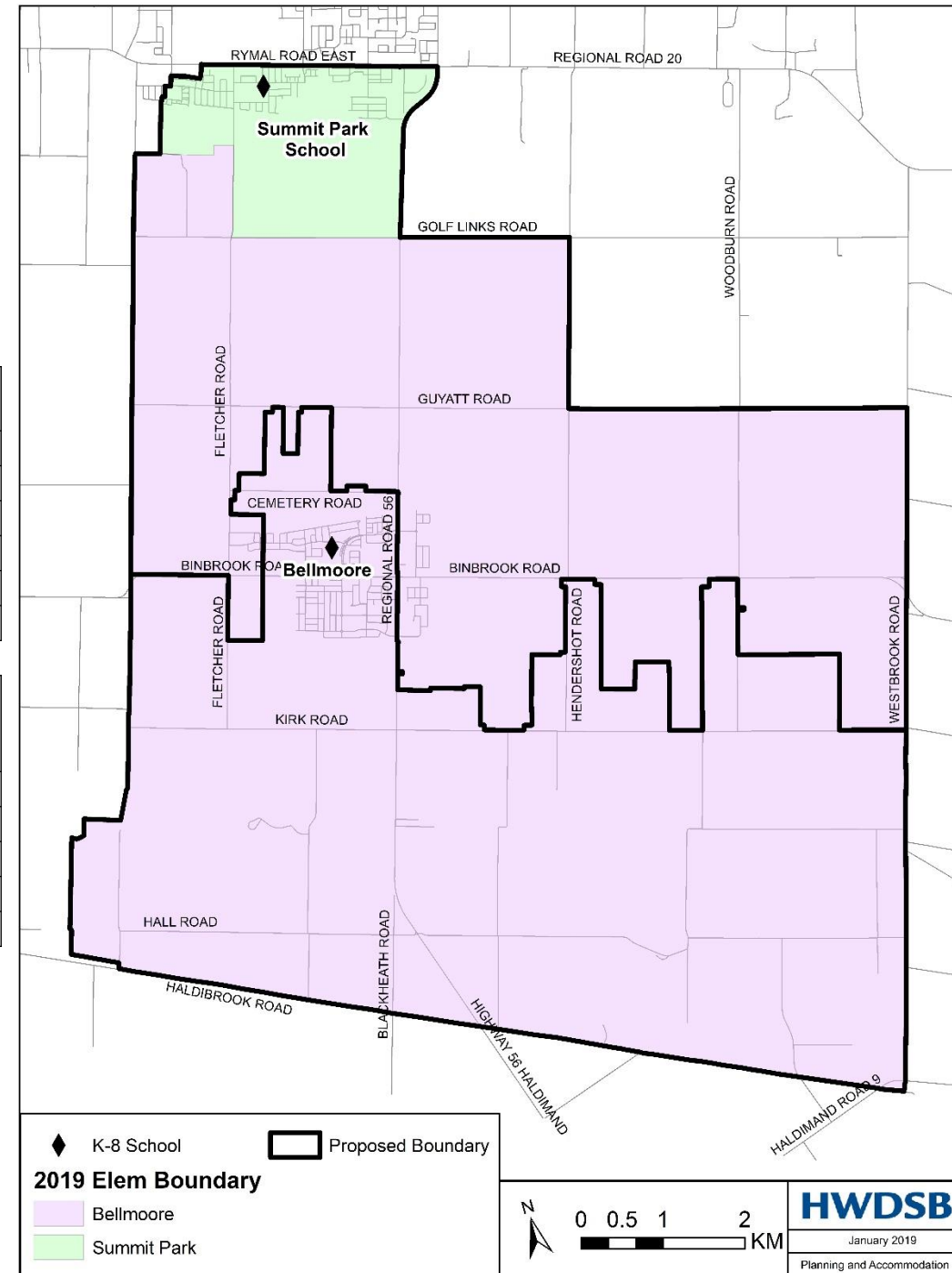

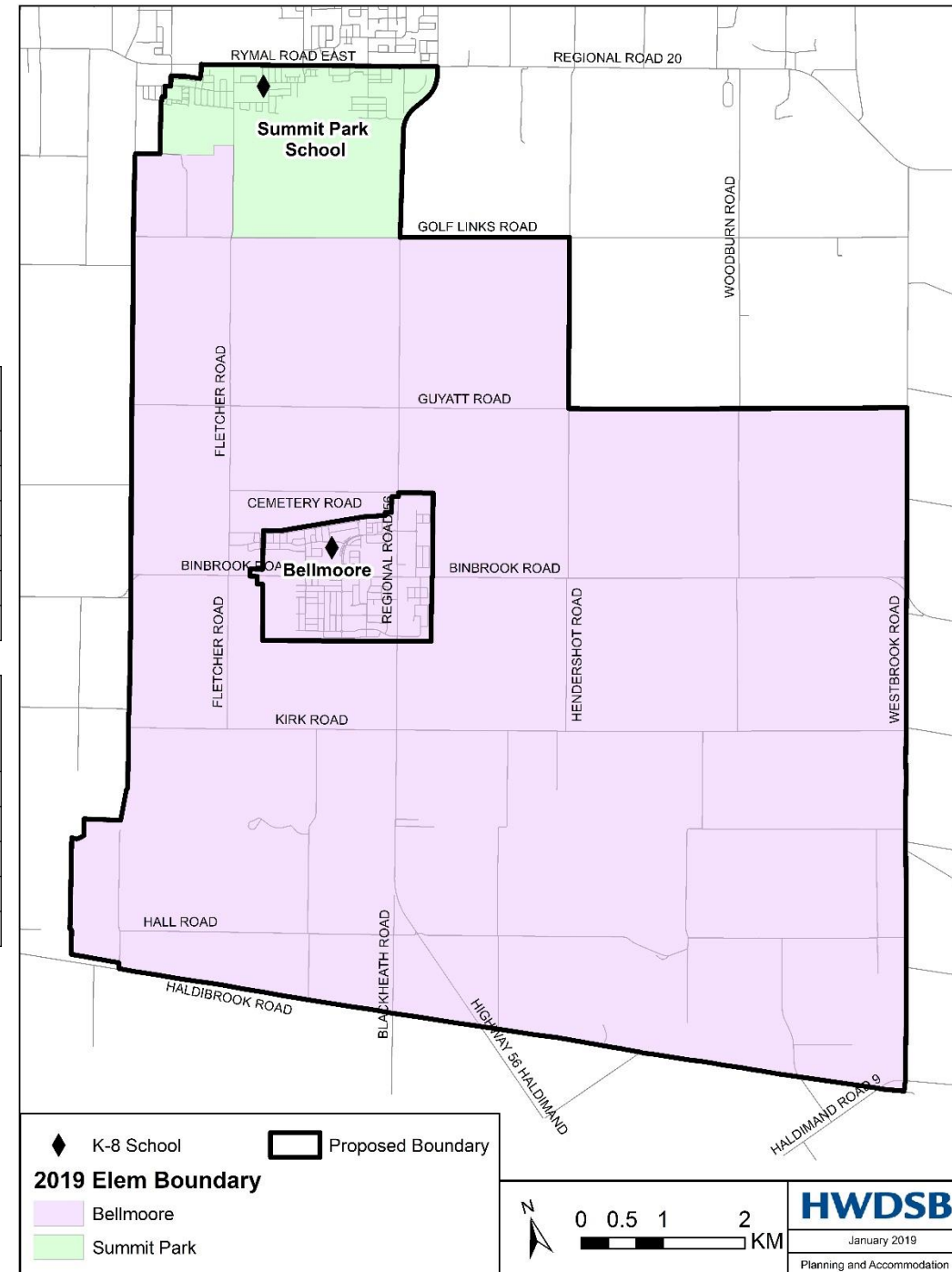

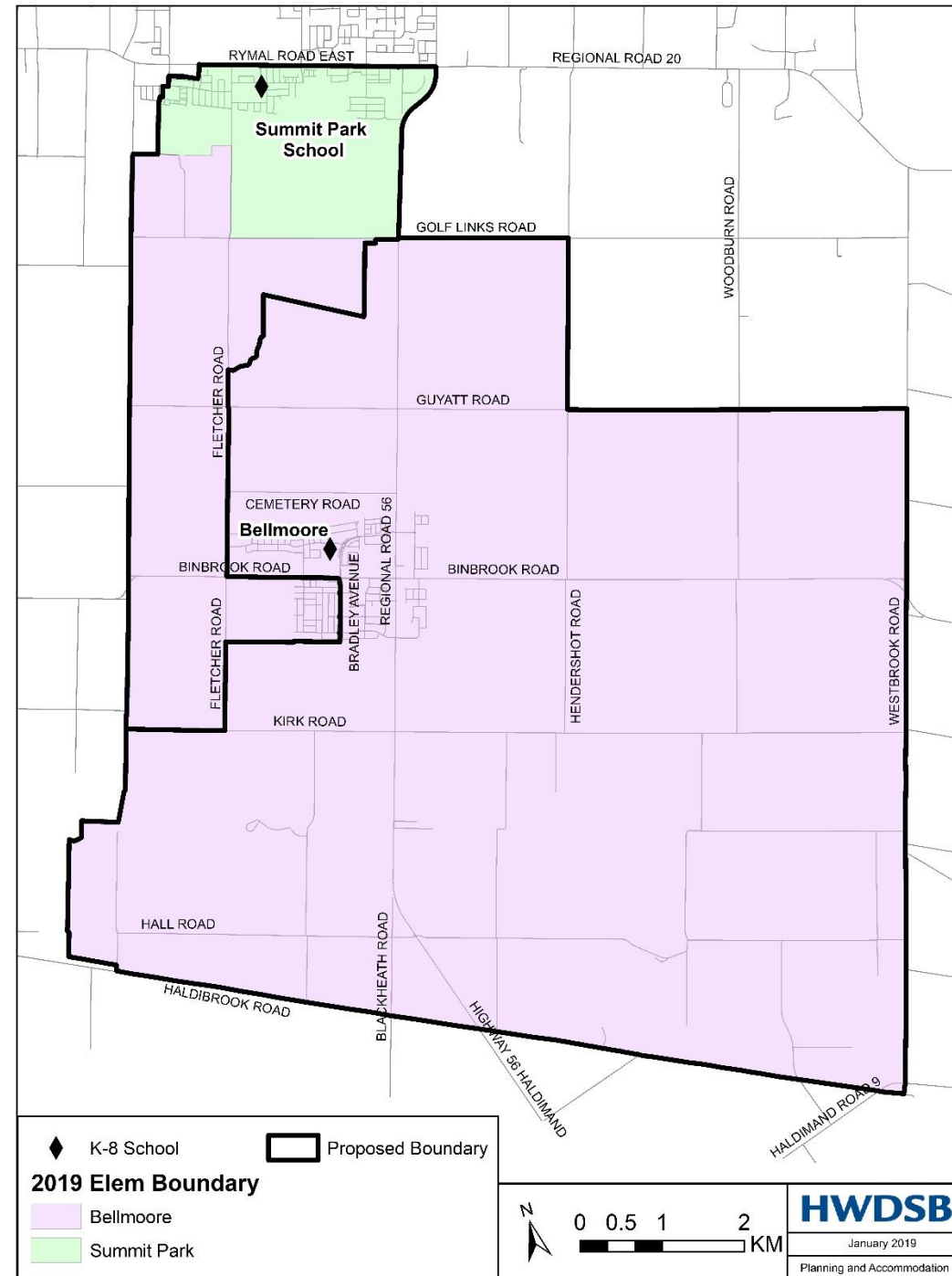

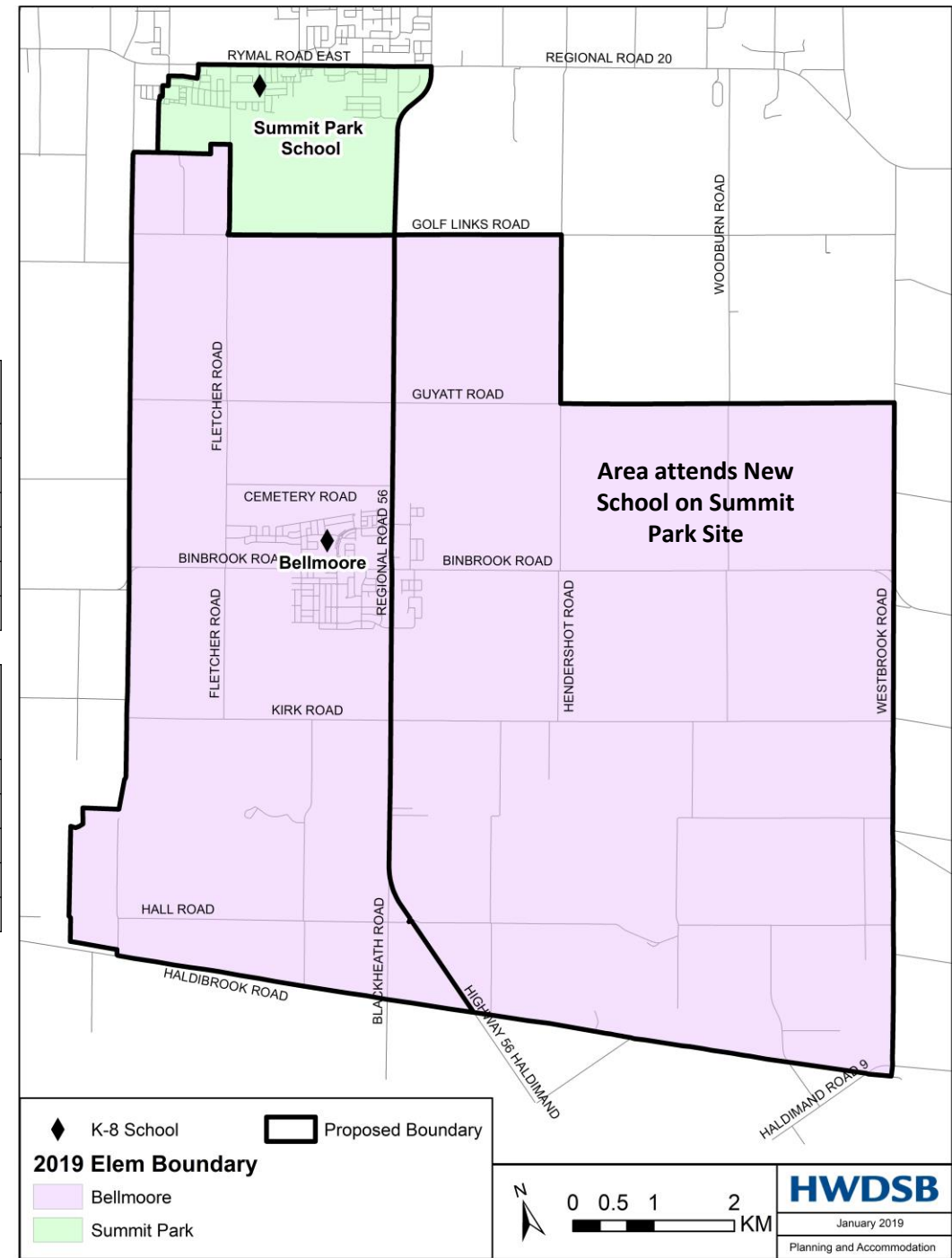
