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Will using TipOff cost me money?

It depends on your phone plan. Standard text messaging rates apply.

#### What should I report?

We hope you will share anonymous tips on bullying, student safety and crime to make you school safer.

#### What number do I text?

You can text 905-963-0066. You can also use web chat at http://goo.gl/kq4snT or download and use the smartphone app. This creates what we call a 'conversation.'

#### Can I also call that number?

Yes, but TipOff will not engage in phone conversations. The automated prompts allow you to connect via text, or to contact emergency supports.

### Will TipOff provide counselling?

No. TipOff's operator will never offer counselling. It is an information service. It will refer you to 911 if you are in crisis. Your school can provide the full support it does every day.

### How will my tip be used?


TipOff labels each tip according to the type of incident and where it occurred. (e.g. #bullying, #theft, #onschoolproperty).

Labels help HWDSB learn more about the needs of our students and schools. It also helps staff understand how TipOff is being used.

Your tip will always remain anonymous in the TipOff system. School officials may ask for your identity if your tip is of an urgent nature that requires face-toface conversation.

HWDSB staff review conversations frequently to understand how tips are handled, how many tips are being received and how satisfied users are with





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
