#### Construction Notice for contract C15-49-17 (P) Beasley Park Redevelopment

The City of Hamilton has a contract with Newman Bros. Ltd. to complete works as called for under contract C15-49-17 (P). This notice is to advise you construction is scheduled to start on or about March 19, 2018 and be substantially completed by August 31, 2018, weather permitting.

The work involves the construction of a new skate park, splash pad, playground, concrete works, and associated utility works. During this time you may experience some inconveniences such as noise, dust, and restricted traffic movement. 
