

## DVSS School Council Meeting

Tuesday October 18, 2016 @ 6:30

Location: Library

1. Welcome and Introductions: Co-Chairs, N. Watt and A. Hampson

2. Approval of Sept 2016 minutes: C. Evans and S. Kennedy

3. DVSS School Prime Minister's Report: Nick Mitchell couldn't be present but sent a video report. <https://youtu.be/SHSyllkcuGQ>

4. Teachers report:

Staff have had training on iPads, leveraging digital technology.

Staff have also had HWDSB wide training, grouped by grade level and subject which facilitated collaboration.

Some of our classrooms are working to create Global Connectivity and Creativity. The class worked with an Australian Students through Google docs on a Physics Assignment. J. Nash asks if the instruction was mandated and E. Delsordo indicates it is.

There is a sum of \$1000 that has been carried over from last years graduating class. Traditionally the Graduates vote on how to spend the money on something for the school/remaining students to enjoy. They will vote on this as well as ways to spend the current years budget.

N. Watts asks if there are class/grade reps? E. Delsordo indicates that a staff member, E. Hazard, has just stepped into the position of teacher advisor for school council and N. Watts asks if we could possibly have her speak at our next meeting?

Question regarding percentage of cafeteria used during lunch hour? E. Delsordo indicates that the cafeteria is only at 75% capacity. C. Pillinini and G. Cipriani mention that the students hang out in the front lobby as well as in teachers classrooms. There is a comment made regarding chairs being left on tables which may be intimidating for some students. L. McArthur suggests that the chairs be taken off the tables prior to lunch hour to make it less intimidating??

VIVE: Grade 9 evening with activities , dinner and a dance. Oct 21st after school until 9:30pm. 95% of Grade 9 students have signed up to participate in this activity.

5. Principal's Report

a) Rean Heckrodt: Acknowledgement of his passing. Support services were made available to the students and they were encouraged to use the services as needed. The school social worker comes up with a plan to service students needs and that may include trauma team and counsellors. A book of condolences was available for students to grieve and leave messages. A. Hampson mentions that flowers were sent to the funeral on behalf of council.

b) Report Cards: Prelim reports went home Oct 13. E. Delsordo reminds parents to book their parent/teacher interviews online. L. McArthur is concerned with the limited number of spaces for parent teacher interviews. Asks if there is any other option if time slots are already full?? E. Delsordo indicates that teachers are open to individual appointments and to directly contact the

teacher. L. Howie suggests we consider or look into an early dismissal on interview day to accommodate more interview times. She indicates that it is a system that St Marys uses. E. Delsordo recommends we email our Superintendent and Trustee to recommend this idea. G. Cipriani mentions that while Math, Science and English are often fully booked (especially in grade 11 & 12) C. Pillinini mentions that the other teachers are often sitting with no interviews.

OSSLT( Grade 10 literacy test) to hold a trial run for approx. 30 students per school across the Province to test the new online testing system which the Ministry is trying to get up and running for the spring Province wide test. The students who successfully complete the test now will not have to rewrite it in the spring.

and speaker options to consider. J. Kleeven suggests council decide what the focus or issue is that we would like to cover and then search for a speaker that way. It is suggested we look into Drug/Alcohol and Safe choices. Police services are a resource we could utilize. J. Kleeven suggests doing multiple mini sessions that parents could rotate through covering mental health, drug/alcohol use, etc.
