Planning for Success:

Tip #1 Start planning **early!**

Tip # 2 Choose a camp that is a good fit for your child.

Tip # 3 Assess the camp's attitude towards inclusion

Tip # 4 Consider Support Needs and Options (Is 1-1 needed?)

Tip # 5 Provide the right Information (Challenges, favorites, safety concerns)

Tip #6 Get the week off to a good start (Visit before if possible, don't rush when you drop off to see your child through the initial transition)

Tip #7 Communicate (Both before camp starts and during camp)

Sharing Information With Camp Staff:

Some parents are reluctant to share too much information with camp staff for fear it will have negative repercussions for their child (for example, they may wonder if the camp will still take their child or if they're setting their child up for failure). But good camps will want and need to know as much as possible — the more information they have, the better. Consult with your child's doctor and other specialists, such as a physical therapist, to make sure you give the camp director and staff all necessary information, and ask the camp staff if they have everything they need from you. You can help educate the staff by spending time with them and answering and asking questions before you drop off your child. This can be critical. For example, if your child will be attending a mainstream camp, you'll want to make sure that everything is accessible for your child and that the staff understands your child's needs. Many camps have paperwork you can fill out to share information about things like dietary and medical needs. And regardless of whether your child is going to a day or residential camp, you should give the staff a list of emergency phone numbers and email addresses, and make sure they know how to reach you at all times during your child's camp stay. If your child takes any medication, include the phone number of your doctor in case the prescription is lost and needs to be refilled by camp staff. Check whether the camp infirmary stocks your child's medication, too. If it doesn't, send extra medicine in case of an emergency.

What are your program's ratio's ?

How many children do you allow per session?

What is the average age of your staff?

Is your site accessible?

Do you have an inclusion policy?

Do you have a camper code of conduct?

Is your program accredited by any organization?
Are all your staff CPR and First Aid trained?
Are leaders in training counted in your ratio?
How much time do you spend outdoors?
What do you do if the weather is bad?
Can I arrange a time to see the camp ahead of time?
What supports does your program offer?
Do you have funding assistance?
What qualities do you look for in your staff?
Where do you recruit staff?
What do you include in your staff training?
What training do your support staff receive?
Do you have guidelines for private workers?
Do I receive a discount with a private worker?
Are there families or past campers I could talk to about your camp?
Do you provide transportation?
How do you support your staff?
What happens if things go badly for whatever reason?
Can I drop into camp during the day?
