- We are organizing a Student Volunteer/Leader celebration in June and are asking to use Pizza Points to purchase pizza for the kids on that day. We are planning on having the celebration on a non-pizza day.
- We are very fortunate to be getting a fresh coat of paint on the stage prior to our Lion King Production. Mrs. Tovey has requested that our stage be painted black and that has been approved.

School Spending/Budget

- Staff have been spending the \$200 (per teacher) allocated by School Council on a number of items such as science and technology supplies, headphones, math software, individual whiteboards, art supplies, wooden table and chairs, scratch board sets, language software, apple TV, French books and Phys. Ed. equipment.
- The school has also provided approximately \$250 per classroom to be spent on classroom supplies (construction paper, notebooks, pencils, crayons etc.).
- Teachers were very appreciative of these funds and felt like it was an appropriate amount to meet their classroom needs.
- Students have come to us requesting updated equipment for our outdoor equipment chest. We are asking for \$200 from School Council in order to add to our outdoor play equipment. Items such as soccer balls, basketballs, skipping ropes etc. will be purchased.
