3) Principal's Report

Introduction of myself: This is my second year at FC. I was previously the Vice-Principal of Bellmoore for 3 ½ years and I have been teaching with HWDSB for the last 20 years, in a variety of capacities (Library, Grade 4, Grade 5 Grade 7-8, Health and Phys. Ed.). I was born, raised and educated in Hamilton and currently reside on the Stoney Creek Mountain. Education; I hold a Bachelor of Arts from McMaster University along with a Bachelor of Commerce, Bachelor of Education and a Masters of Education from the University of Windsor. I don't have any children of my own but do have three nephews who are a huge part of my life – family is very important to me.

Staffing Updates:

Ms. Babb (Office Administrator) has taken a role at the Ed. Centre for this school year and will be returning in September of 2018. Until her replacement, Mrs. Wojtasik, is able to begin in November, we have Mrs. Porritt and Mrs. Steven are joining us in the office.

As you are all aware Mr. MacLean is currently on a year leave. Mr. Zagorac is with us again in the library, as well as teaching some primary music & physical education. We also welcome Mr. Gourlay to our Gr. 2/3 class.

School:

JK-Gr. 8 Population of 254 students

Currently 13.4 teachers, 2 Educational Assistants, 1 Early Childhood Educator, 2 Office Administrators (each working half time), 1 Principal

Organization of our 10 classes: JK/SK; 1; 2/3; 4/5; 6, 6, 7, 7, 8, 8

Reorganization:

As a result of unanticipated increases to student enrolment and in order to comply with provincial class size requirements, we will be having to make some adjustments to our school

classroom organizations. This is a fairly common occurrence that is taking place in many elementary schools throughout HWDSB. Specifically, at our school we have gained 1.2 teachers and will be opening a class in the junior/intermediate division. As a result of reorganization, Mr. Ruttan will now be with us for three days a week, instead of two and all students in grades 6-8 will be receiving instrumental music.

The process of opening a class involves changes to our school's timetable as well as changing the homeroom of some students. We will make this transition as smoothly as possible at the end of next week. The end result will be smaller class sizes for each of our middle school classrooms.

As we did in the spring, the staff at Flamborough Centre will take every consideration into account as we discuss student moves. Our mandate is to have the least disruption to program as possible, and to ensure that student learning, friendships and access to support continue at all times. Changes to classes or schedules will not occur prior to Friday September 29, 2017, at which point any official changes will go into effect.

As we move through this process and specific details are known, I will ensure that it is communicated to those impacted.

Volunteer Policy Update:

A change in practice as of last year - regular and continuous Non-Staff Volunteers will provide, for review, a new Vulnerable Sector Screening every three years – an Offence Declaration will be completed annually until the VSS is due again in the third year. The Vulnerable Sector Screening is the property of the Volunteer. A break in volunteer service of one year or more or beginning as a Volunteer in a new school will require a new Vulnerable Sector Screening to be presented for review. The VSS needs to be on file for all volunteer drivers as well.
