Growing Pains – Public Board to Review Immersion in 2010/11



Over the past five years, the Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board has made positive changes to the French Immersion program. New FI sites have opened in Waterdown, Dundas, Ancaster and the East Mountain, and bussing for FI students has been introduced for the first time in the program's 30 year history.

As a result, enrollment in the FI program has climbed and interest continues to grow. Student capacity has become an issue at FI schools across the city - even new sites such as Lawfield. At Norwood Park, the Board's only single track FI school, enrollment is approaching 600 students, some of whom have to navigate between ten portables.

In order to address these issues, the Public School Board is launching a three point review of French Immersion this Fall. The Review will set out policies and principles to deal with the following issues:

- Accommodation: new school sites, expanded sites, high school sites, portables & portapacks
- Program: single track, dual track, program entry point, resources & materials, teacher support systems
- Transportation: enhanced routes and service, budget, coordination with Catholic school board

Draft policies are expected by the end of 2010, with public consultation starting this winter. Get involved. Speak to your school council members and contact CPF to be kept informed. CPF Hamilton-Wentworth will continue to monitor the review process and advocate for enhanced French Immersion programming in Hamilton.
