

January is a great time for baking treats that will warm you from the inside out. This month we have enjoyed baking banana muffins, oatmeal raisin cookies and cranberry orange muffins. We also made modelling clay from scratch.

Banana Muffins

Ingredients:

1½ cup flour

1 cup sugar

1 tsp baking powder

1 tsp baking soda

½ tsp salt

1/4 cup vegetable oil

1/4 cup milk

3 medium mashed bananas

1 tsp vanilla extract

Instructions:

Mash the bananas until smooth.

Add oil, milk and vanilla mixing until combined.

Slowing add in the dry ingredients, while mixing the batter.

Spoon batter evenly into 12 lined muffin tins

Bake at 375° for 16-20 minutes.

Cool in muffin tins.




