PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

I have always felt like September is similar to New Years. It marks a time of new beginnings, fresh starts, reconnecting, and making plans to move forward. For some of you, your connection with Glenwood Special Day School is new and we welcome you. We have some new students, families, teachers and EAs joining Glenwood. Over the summer 2 LTO teachers were hired, 7 full time EA positions were filled, and 1 full time teacher joined us. We are starting our year with 41 students and 47 staff. I am very excited about the team we are building here at Glenwood.

During the summer, renovations continued to take place at the school to align with the **Structured TEACCH** programming model. Another classroom was completely renovated (bring our total to 4 classrooms) and 2 other classes had significant work done to them. A component of Structured TEACCH is to create a learning environment that is calm, with less distractions and with purposeful areas that allow for teaching, independent work, leisure and relaxation and group activities. In partnership with our new Intensive Support Services team (formerly the ASD and AAC team), we are continuing to move forward with increasing our students' **COMMUNICATION, INDEPENDENCE, TRANSITION** and **LIFE SKILLS**.

I was very fortunate this summer to attend a week of Structured TEACCH training in North Carolina. It was amazing to learn more and to celebrate how well we are already implementing this program at Glenwood. Most importantly, it was wonderful to see the gains our students have made and how quickly they have adjusted back to our school routine.

Another part of September involves planning together. As with any school, it is critical to have a strong partnership with our parents and guardian. Glenwood has a strong history in this area and we are very fortunate.

Our **first Parent Council meeting** will be on **October 5, at 6-7 pm**. If you are interested in joining, please come out and learn more.

As you read our September Newsletter, please join me in having great optimism for our 2016-17 school year and the meaningful student and staff learning at Glenwood, **'a special place to learn.'**

STUDENT EMERGENCY INFORMATION AND MEDICAL INFORMATION

You should have received some forms at the end of June (or beginning of September) to be completed and returned to school for the start of school in September.

Among them were requests for CONTACT/EMERGENCY INFORMATION (NAMES, PHONE NUMBERS, ETC), SEIZURE PROTOCOL INFORMATION AND MEDICAL INFORMATION. A critical part of that package was a form authorizing us to **ADMINISTER MEDICATION.**

It should have been signed by the doctor, and included important details related to the administration of medications for those who require them. **SOME HAVE NOT BEEN RETURNED.** If you did not give us the necessary forms and permission to administer medications, please send them in right away along with the medication, if it has not already been sent in, (Remember that medication should be received in its **original container** with the **pharmacy**

label naming the patient, doctor, medication, dosage and time to administer)

Please send this information to the school if you have not already done so. **WE CAN NOT**

Please be aware that with the many special needs of students being transported occasional delays may occur in the transportation process. You are asked to have your child ready for pick-up in the morning approximately ten minutes before the assigned pick-up time. At the end of the day **SOMEONE MUST BE READY AND AVAILABLE TO RECEIVE THE STUDENT AT THE BUS/TAXI DROP OFF LOCATION.**

Board's Transportation Policy. Occasionally, service must be withdrawn either temporarily or permanently because of student safety concerns. Every effort is made to work with families to respond to needs as they arise. Whether it is another child or your own, problems may occasionally arise. We encourage your patience and understanding.

GREAT BUS DRIVERS AND SERVICE

We want to acknowledge Attridge Transportation and our bus drivers for the great care and concern they show for our students daily. It is a tremendous responsibility to drive a bus loaded with students with special needs and ensure their safety.

As many of you are well aware, it is NOT possible to give everyone "the optimum" pickup or drop off time. While efforts are sometimes made to accommodate needs and requests, it is not always possible. With so many students to gather from over such a wide area your patience and understanding will be necessary at times. This may well mean that families will need to make special arrangements to facilitate the assigned pickup and drop off times.

REMINDER - *Be prepared for both the "Pickup" and "Drop off" each day.*

If your child is absent please remember to call and cancel transportation. It may require calling BOTH the before and after school carriers if they are different.

PARENT VISITS TO THE SCHOOL

Parents are welcome in the school at any time and we value your input. However, you are asked to plan your visit ahead of time if you are hoping to speak with a teacher or to the principal. Most of the time staff are busy with classes and other tasks and, unfortunately, may not be readily available to speak with you on a “walk-in” basis.

SIGN IN - When you come to the school please ring the doorbell at the front door. Be patient as the office lets you in. (Doors are locked for the safety of students and the security of the building) Upon entry to and exit from the school please go to the office and sign in and out. Wear the VISITOR TAG provided at the office. This is your authorization to be in the building and provides a record of your visit.

INDIVIDUAL EDUCATION PLANS (IEPs)

Teachers will be reviewing and writing the 2016-2017 Individual Education Plans and will contact parents to discuss and fine tune the IEP during September and early October. You are encouraged to be a part of this process.

STUDENT INSURANCE

You will have received packages to be used to enroll for Student Insurance again this year, If you plan to take it, please complete it and return to the Reliable Insurance Company. **DO NOT SEND THEM TO THE SCHOOL.**

LUNCH AT SCHOOL

At Glenwood **students bring their own lunches** and snacks (am and pm). We would encourage you to do two things:

1. Provide a nourishing and substantial lunch/snack for your child
2. Discuss size/amount of food that your child is eating/not eating with the teacher.

This communication will help you to know if more, less or different food should be considered. Don't take this as

criticism when it occurs...it is simply an effort to align consumption needs with what students are bringing. Invariably, questions do arise about this, but while we do encourage students to eat their lunch in the best way possible, we do not force them to eat everything in their lunch bag.

Pupils stay for lunch and will eat in the designated area. At approximately 12:30 students go outside for a noon recess time and an opportunity for exercise and fresh air.

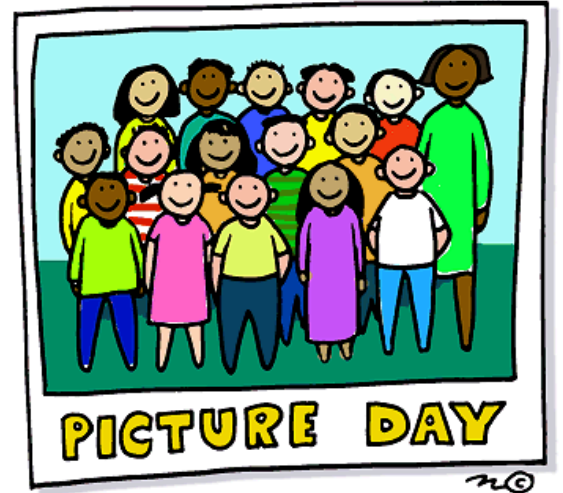
