- 1. Welcome and introductions: Council received a thank you card from Ms. Minaker.
- 2. Declaration of Conflict of Interest none declared.
- 3. Approval of Minutes June 2017 minutes approved. Motioned by Ms. Vanstone, seconded by Ms. Church.
- 4. Elections Ms. Church was nominated for Chair by Ms. Vanstone and seconded by Ms. Babbey. Ms. Babbey will remain secretary and Ms. Nalsok will remain treasurer.
- 5. Pro Grant the application is still under review for a multicultural night. Ms. Church will follow up at the end of September if no news.
- 6. Fundraising Initiatives for 2017 2018 last year a lot of ideas but also need to be realistic with the goals. Would like to fundraise for school trips (to help subsidy buses), new sports team shirts and uniforms, shade tent for the teams, and outdoor play equipment. Mr. Kirkelos would know the price for the uniforms. Would like to do the Indigo fundraiser again, but this time chose the cash option as opposed to gift cards. Discussed having bake sales for all events and can even do for Meet the Teacher. Ms. Nalsok is willing to look into pizza days if nobody else is using it as a fundraiser this year. Will need to talk to Ms. Aitken about going cashless for the pizza. Ms. Church's mother will also help. Will need to talk to Ms. Cave about the dates of Pita Pit. Will touch base with Ms. Dempsey and Ms. Gear about the volunteers helping out with pizza and could also approach student leadership team to help on the day of.
