

A Message About Halloween from the Heart and Stroke Society

October means Halloween! Here's some tips on how to have all the fun with a little less candy! While sugar-laden treats are a big part of the occasion, there are ways to reduce the amount of sugar kids consume. These tips from our registered dietitians will help your family enjoy a healthier Halloween:

Make sure trick-or-treaters fill up on a healthy meal before they set out. Set a strict rule of no sampling on the go Walk with kids rather than drive them. The activity is good for you too! Managing the stash- Take control over the candy after arriving home. Sort through it and discard any questionable items. Create a "least favourite" pile and toss those too. In some families, the "Switch Witch" visits after kids are asleep to take away excess candy and leave a toy or trinket in its place. Allow your child to make daily withdrawals from a "candy bank" so you can monitor their intake. Put an expiration date on the haul – for example, two weeks – and throw the rest away.

EQAO Update

Every year, students in Grades 3 and 6 write the provincial EQAO test which assesses their skills in Reading, Writing and Math. The results of these tests will be sent home along with a Guide for Parents of students in Grade 3 & 6. If you have a child who attended our school and was in Grade 3 or 6 last year, your child will receive their results from their classroom teacher/advisor.

If your child wrote the test but did not attend Helen Detwiler School last year, their results will be forwarded to us by the previous school and we will send them to you. If you have not received them by the end of October, you can contact the previous school or let us know and we will follow up for you. Transportation Parent Portal



The Parent's Portal tool on the HWSTS website (www.hamiltonschoolbus.ca) allows parents/guardians to create a secure online account where they can access transportation details for their

child(s). Parents with accounts can choose to receive email notification when their bus is delayed by more than 10 minutes.

As part of the Parent's Portal Tool, parents/guardians of JK & SK students can provide names of individuals (including siblings 12yrs+) whom they wish to designate as authorized to receive their child. This list of authorized individuals is made available to the appropriate bus operator to assist with allowing the kindergarten students to leave the bus.

Nutrition Policy



HWDSB's Nutrition Policy guides school communities in the development of healthy school nutrition environments in which

Parent Drop Off & Pick Up

With close to 550 students entering and exiting the building on a daily basis, we ask that you are patient and cautious when driving down Brigade Drive. Setting a designated area that is off school grounds will make for an easier drop off and pick up routine for you and your child. Parents, if you plan to drop off or pick up your child, you must determine a meeting point location that is off school grounds to ensure the safety of our bussed students & families exiting the building in front of the school. If you are coming into the school for a meeting or to visit the office, we ask that you please park at the Ontario Early Years Community Agency/Partnership Parking lot, located Southeast of the school. We thank you for relying on the Southeast parking lot and supporting the safety of our students every day.
