



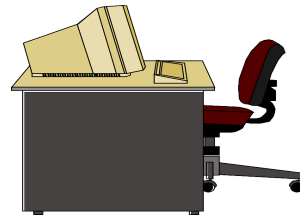

School Council

We welcome any parents that are interested in being a part of Helen Detwiler's School Council. The role of School Council is to advise School Staff of recommendations for our School Improvement Plan. Meeting dates for the remainder of the year will be determined by council at our first meeting. All parents/guardians are welcome to attend School Council Meetings.

Parents/Guardians - Visitors to the Office

All parents/visitors **must first report to the office when coming into the school**. To ensure the safety of everyone in the building we must be aware of all parents/visitors that are in the school. Once you have reported to the office, our office administrators will be happy to help you. If you would like to get in touch with your child's teacher, we advise that a note be recorded in your child's agenda. This will ensure a quick & timely response from your child's teacher. You are also welcome to contact the school. A message left at the office will be shared with your child's teacher who will contact you to make arrangements.

Allergy Alert

A reminder that Helen Detwiler is a **NUT SAFE** school. For the safety of all our students, please do not send peanut or nut products to school. Thank you.

Student Information Package

The first week of school, your child brought home an information package with various forms for you to fill out. These forms are necessary for the classroom teacher and office. Please complete all the forms and return them to school as soon as possible. Thank you.

Students With Medical Needs



If your child has a medical condition for which he/she requires medication or special accommodation(s) at school, a form will be sent home for you and your physician to complete. In order to

administer medication to students, the school requires proper signed documentation. Thank you for your support.

Bus Transportation

If you have submitted a courtesy transportation form, we thank you for your continued patience with this process.

We would like to remind parents that students are **not** covered for liability by the board and are not permitted to ride on the bus until they are approved by Transportation Services. It will take the month of September to organize and process transportation requests and await approval in October. Thank you for your patience.



Student Agendas

Your child has received his/her new Student Agenda for the 2018/19 school year. This is an important organizational & communication tool which all students will be encouraged and expected to use. Under the HWDSB School Fees Policy, the \$5.00 fee for the Agenda is optional. We will use any donations collected to offset the cost to the school. Please submit donations to your child's homeroom teacher by Thursday, September 20th. Thank you for your support.

Pizza Days begins Thursday September 20th!

Pizza orders for students will be taken on Thurs. Sept. 20th. The cost per slice is \$1.50. Pizza will be handed out on Thursday of each week. Cheese and/or cheese & pepperoni on a regular white crust will be available for purchase. Both kinds meet the School Food and Beverage Policy guidelines. For the month of September, **we will only be accepting money orders**. School Cash Online will be set up in October. If you haven't already done so please sign up



today, this registration stays with your child right through grade 12. All JK and new students to Helen Detwiler will not be able to sign up for Cash Online until September 28, 2018.

Parking Protocol

A reminder that no one is permitted to park in the roundabout by the Kindergarten classes. This is for pick up and drop off only. All school & board support staff will park at our main staff parking located next to the school. To ensure the safety of our students, the **staff parking lot is out of bounds** to our students & parents. If you are coming into the school for a meeting or to visit the office, we ask that you please park at the Early ON Child & Family Centre Parking lot, located Southeast of the school. By-law signs stating **Employee Parking Only** and **No Parking** are visibly posted as a reminder for you. Please note that by-law officers will be monitoring these areas frequently for ticketing purposes with student safety in mind. We thank you for supporting the safety of our students every day.

Supervision

Just a reminder that morning supervision on the playground does not begin until 15 minutes before the start of classes which is 8:20 a.m. If your child is on the playground before that time, please understand that they are **not** being supervised by an adult. Similarly, at the end of the day, there is supervision until 3:05 p.m. Please encourage your child to go directly home after school in order to ensure their safety.

HWDSB Nutrition Policy

The purpose of the policy is to guide school communities in the development of healthy school nutrition environments in which everyone is encouraged to make nutritious food choices and beverage choices. All food and beverages fit into one of 3 categories: serve/sell most, serve/sell less and not permitted for sale or to be served. Below are a few highlights that reinforce the Policy & its implementation:

- ❖ Food is not to be used as an individual reward or an incentive for good behaviour, achievement, or participation in classrooms
- ❖ Food incentives or rewards are permitted for groups, clubs or classes as long as it complies with the standards of the policy (Ex. fruit & veggie trays for classroom birthday celebrations)
- ❖ Nutritional standards do not apply to food & beverages available for purchase during field trips off school premises
- ❖ Schools will not serve or sell commercially bottled water
- ❖ Schools are entitled to 10 Special Event Days in which food & beverages sold or served in schools are exempt from the nutrition standard outlined in the Policy

Please note that **Nutrition Break #2** is considered to be lunch and students who go home for lunch would leave at this time. Students who fill out forms to stay at school for lunch must bring a **dated and signed** note from their parent/guardian **each** time they have been given permission to leave. This is imperative in order to assure that the school knows the whereabouts of our students at all times.

Playground Safety

Our school outdoor field is adjacent to a park which has a creative playground. Each year many children suffer injuries on playgrounds particularly strangulation. Here are some safety tips:

- Remove cords and drawstrings from children's hoods, hats, and jackets
- Tuck in all clothing that can get caught on playground equipment
- Wear a neck warmer instead of a scarf
- Take off bicycle helmets before using playground equipment -they can get caught on equipment and strangle a child
- Make sure children do not tie ropes or skipping ropes to slides and other playground equipment
- Supervise children on the playground
- Teach children how to use playground equipment and play safely

Please note that the creative playground is not on school property and is **not** supervised by staff. Many incidents have happened there both before and after school. In order to minimize conflicts and injuries, please encourage your children to go directly home or discuss proper behaviour and safety with your children when they are at the park.
