#### **Buddy Benches Update:**

- Contacted Angela Ferguson and Greg Clark (principal's at Westmount and Sir Allan MacNab)
- Stated their tech departments would be interested in supporting the school by building buddy benches
- JMac would need to supply the materials but the teams would design and build the benches

#### **Projector and Screen:**

#### **Coding Club:**

- Partnering with Industrial Education Hamilton who runs a Coding Club for Grade 4 to 8
- Will accommodate up to 30 students interested in learning more about technology and potential career paths
- Program runs 8 weeks beginning the end of January
