Principal's Report – November 2nd, 2016

School population has begun to stabilize. Current population is 327 (-2)

LLI/Empower:

- 12 students involved in 3 separate groups of Levelled Literacy Intervention
- PALS reading program which focusses on decoding and fluency
- 13 students involved in Empower

Big Brothers Big Sisters Partnership:

- Connections Project Children enrolled in are newcomer youth who often need a friend or a mentor to help them build confidence and navigate their new home
- Game On! providing boys with information and support to make informed choices about a range of healthy lifestyle practices such as eating habits, fair play, working with others. Combines physical activity and emotional health discussions
- Also some one-to-one mentoring occurring within the school

SchoolCashNet:

- Has restarted as of November 1st
- Online service for parents to access and make payments to special events, trips, etc.

- Parents can contact the main office to get their child's PIN number in order to sign up
- Mrs. Baker will be posting something on the web notifying caregivers that they can call to find out their child's PIN

Indigo Adopt a School:
