Courtesy Transportation:

We are preparing for a smooth beginning of the 2015-16 school year. Many of our students qualify for transportation (gr.1-6 must be a minimum of 1.6 km from the school and JK/SK must be a minimum of 1.0 km) and others we have been able to provide courtesy transportation. We will continue to follow the same process as last year, where families who are interested in courtesy transportation can apply in September and will be considered for approval when we know how much space is available on our buses. I thank you in advance for continuing to follow this process as it is extremely important to know who is on the bus at all times. There are a few students in Senior Kindergarten who currently qualify for transportation; however, as they will be in grade 1 next year they will have to apply to be a courtesy rider in 2015-16. Ms. Wright will connect with those parents to ensure a clear and safe transition.

EQAO Update:

From Monday, May 25 to Thursday, June 4, student s in grade 3 and 6 will be participating in the Education Quality and Accountability Office's (EQAO's) Assessment of Reading, Writing and Mathematics. In six sessions, students will complete a variety of assessment activities designed to allow them to demonstrate their skills and knowledge relating to reading, writing and mathematics as described in *The Ontario Curriculum*. The assessment is administered province-wide and is developed by assessment experts and Ontario teachers to reflect curriculum expectations. We ask parents of these children to please avoid appointments during these two weeks and help ensure a timely arrival to school. Along with this newsletter, our board has provided some additional strategies to support your son or daughter.
