Principal's Message

Lots of greats things happening in our school and I wanted to share a few of them here. When I arrived at this school in September I was immediately impressed with the way that students supported and cared for each other. One prime example is the bus buddy program where older students help and look after the kindergarten students on the bus. These older students do an amazing job of making sure their bus buddies are safe and happy. Our older students also act as classroom lunch monitors and peer mediators outside during breaks; again, our students work together wonderfully.

I also noticed how many different opportunities there are for students to participate in extracurricular clubs, teams, and events. I appreciate these extra opportunities that staff provide for our students.

Three of our grade eight students created, organized, and led the Mountain View Cares campaign for the Ronald McDonald House in Hamilton. Electronics Policy Updated

We have updated our electronics policy with the support and help from school council, staff, and students (from student council).

As a parent myself I understand how cell phones can support communication between parent and child. My two sons have cell phones so I understand as much of my communication with them is through text.

Here are the two main areas of this policy:

i). Ensure that cell phones and other devices do not interfere with students' learning and experience during school hours (9:00-3:20);

ii). Ensure that parents have means to communicate with their children (and vice-versa) if they need to during these hours, including when they are on the bus

Here are the practical outlines of this policy:

i). Electronics are not be to used any point of the school day without the permission and under the supervision of a staff member. This includes during nutrition breaks (inside and outside). If students need to call home they are welcome to do so using an office phone and if parents need to relay a message of talk with their child we will support that from the main office.

ii). Students caught using the phone without permission will have it confiscated and it will stay in my office until 3:20 p.m. If there are students who repeatedly ignore this then they will begin their day at 9:00 a.m. by giving me their phone to keep safe until 3:20. The phones would be returned to all students at the end of the day (at 3:20); students would come to the office to pick up their phones.

iii). Busing. On the bus I am okay with students texting or calling someone on the phone but not with pictures or videos being taken or viewed. This is consistent with my earlier statement that these electronic devices are used to support communication between parent and child. I have no difficulty with students using their phone to call or text to share information with a parent/ guardian.
