There is not a set "admission" charge instead we are implementing a "Pay what you can" admission fee. Snacks and Drinks will be available for sale (all items will be \$1 and \$2). Funds will support future student events and support Families in Need initiatives. *Children must* be accompanied and supervised by their parents or guardians over the age of 18.

#### **Food Drive at Mount Albion**

Canned/non-perishable food items will be collected up until December 17th, and then they will be delivered to the Stoney Creek Food Bank on December 18th. Please be generous! #### **Cold Weather**

Time spent outdoors is an integral part of the school day at Mount Albion. Children need fresh air and exercise and the opportunity to have a break from the structure of the classroom. With cold weather arriving, it's important for children to come to school prepared for the cold. The City of Hamilton's Public Health and Community Services Department recommends individuals stay indoors when the temperature drops below minus 15 degrees Celsius **without** the wind chill. Please be aware as well, that if students are well enough to come to school, then they are well enough to go

outside for the two 20 minute recesses per day. There is no supervision for children inside when everyone else is outside.

Hats, mitts/gloves, boots, warm layers are very important!

A change of shoes should either be carried back and

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forth, or left at school, since children will not be permitted to wear boots/outer footwear inside the classroom.

### PARKING LOT WOES

Parents—if you are dropping children at school in the morning, or picking them up at the end of the day, please be reminded that **parking in the low**er parking lot is on a first come/first served **basis in designated spots only.** If there are no spots remaining when you arrive, please exit the parking lot, and find a spot on the road. No cars should ever be parked around the periphery of the parking lot—and with snow coming—this is even more important than ever. Once we open the "Kiss and Drop" lane at the upper level of the property, (again—no parking; just a quick stop to "drop"), this should relieve some congestion. We are working with the city to change the street signs on Kennard to allow stopping, once the buses start using our bus lanes. In the meantime, we need to prevent repeat episodes of cars getting stuck, drivers backing up in reverse to maneuver around other cars, cars blocking other cars from entering and exiting the parking lot, etc., and putting pedestrians at risk. Children are never to walk through the parking lot unattended. It is easy to remember—if it isn't a parking spot then please **don't park**. We thank you for your understanding and cooperation!

## Let's Try "Litterless Lunches" and Re-cycling

Students from our SIDD class, the Intermediate ASD class and our Grade 3 class, under the leadership of their teachers and EA's have teamed up to look after paper re-cycling at Mount Albion school. This has been an enormous help to our school, and these students deserve a huge thanks for starting to "green up" Mount Albion. They are able to re-cycle paper and plastic containers that have lids on them. However, we are not equipped to re-cycle compostable items (e.g. food waste), or empty containers such as yogurt cups. With this in mind, we are going to move towards LIT-**TERLESS LUNCHES** at Mount Albion. This means that starting in January, students will be asked to put waste items that cannot be recycled here at school back into their lunch boxes for more appropriate disposal at home.

This may also help you be more aware as to what food items your child is or isn't eating at nutrition break (you might be surprised, for example, at how many sandwiches and pieces of fruit get thrown out with only one bite taken!!). Please help us be environmentally conscious at Mount Albion. Use containers for your child's lunches that will also be used to take everything back home (e.g. ap-

ple cores, empty yogurt cups, etc.). Work with your child on a system that will work for you! Discuss the importance of your child becoming more actively involved in stewardship for our planet.



## **Homework Help**

Did you know? We have a homework club at Mount Albion school every Tuesday at 1st nutrition break....Any students from grades 5 to 8 are encouraged to bring homework or their "unorganized binders and agendas full of papers" to the club.
