A Message from the Principal:

May has arrived, and we begin the final 2 months of school for this year. It is so hard to believe! We hope that you enjoyed Open House this week!!! There was so much for us to celebrate - the new furniture in the Learning Commons, the great art work on display around the school, the generous donations of baskets that we used to support funding for special events at our school, the Book Fair, the amazing work of our students in their classrooms....the list goes on. Thanks for coming out and making our evening a fun event for the families at Mount Albion.

During these busy weeks ahead, I ask that you please consider visiting our website once or twice a week as we have been updating information on a regular basis! Be sure to subscribe as well, so that you get an email notification anytime something new is posted on the website! Have you subscribed to our Twitter account? As you know, it will soon be time for teachers to start the very important process of building classes for next year. The following organization for next year is what has been approved by our Board:

2 FDK classes, Gr 1, Gr 1/2, Gr 2, Gr 2/3, Gr 3/4, Gr 4, Gr 5/6, Gr 6/7, Gr 7/8 A and Gr 7/8 B. We will also have 3 System Special Education Classes. Staffing is not finalized yet, since the Board level staffing process does not get completed until mid June. The school teams including our Resource Teacher, homeroom teachers, rotary teachers and myself spend a number of hours looking at the best organization of classrooms for optimal learning conditions. There are a number of criteria that we use to balance our classes as best we can, complying to provincial and board level class cap sizes, balancing for learning needs, special education support, and more. As always, I invite parents to put any requests for placement for September 2016 into writing, and send a letter to the school to my attention. Requests need to be educationally compelling in nature. Although I cannot guarantee placing your child in a classroom of your choice, I do make every effort to consider your requests whenever possible. Please understand that combined grades are becoming more and more a norm in Hamilton-Wentworth schools, and teachers are trained to deliver the curriculum addressing the scope and depth of the various grades and learning levels within the classroom. The deadline for your letter to be considered is May 31st. On the last day of school in June, students will learn which classroom they will be going to for September 2016, and will participate in a brief transition visit to their new space!

EQAO provincial assessments will be taking place at our school between May 25th and June 8th. This is an assessment for our Grade 3 and Grade 6 students, and the assessments are to gauge student acquisition of knowledge and skills in Mathematics and Language. If you have a child in grade 3 or 6, please endeavour to avoid any absences from school during this assessment period. It is important that the students also arrive at school on time, as some of the assessments will be begin promptly at 8:40 a.m. Please help empower our students by giving them lots of encouragement, that the hard work they are doing now will be reflected in the EQAO assessments this year.

Math, Reading and Writing are components on both the Primary and Junior Assessments. Here are some suggestions that you might find helpful in supporting your child's learning in Writing at home.

PRIMARY

Ask him or her to help you when you write a shopping list, a reminder note, a label, a letter or something similar.

-talk about the different ways to write the information and ideas you want to record.

* Have your child read his or her writing aloud and talk about:

-the similar ideas that might make up a paragraph

-what additional details, phrases and sentences might make the writing clearer and more interesting.

<u>JUNIOR</u>

* Have your child read his or her writing aloud and talk about:

-how to group similar ideas into a paragraph.

-which details make the ideas clearer and which are confusing or repetitive.

-words and phrases that can make the writing more interesting and easier to understand. -how to check to make sure the writing makes sense.
