From the Principal's Desk:

November has arrived and we are hard at work here at Mount Albion! Lots of learning in the classrooms, and lots of activities keeping our students engaged in school life!

Please take note that the Progress Report will be sent home on November 18th. Teachers will be communicating with you to set up interview times so that you have the opportunity to discuss the information on these reports. November 21st is our PA Day, and this date has been set aside for parent/teacher interviews....Some teachers also are able to re-arragned their personal schedules to conduct interviews late afternoon/early evening (between 3:45 to 6:45) on the Thursday before the P.A. Day (Thurs. Nov 20th). So please watch for the information coming home from your child(ren)'s homeroom teacher.

Safety Protocols at Mount Albion:

I just wanted to take this opportunity to remind parents about supervision protocols, as well as the safe school routines that we ask parents to follow both before and after school, as well as entry to the school during the school day.


As outlined in the school agenda, outside supervision starts in the morning at 8:25 a.m. until the entry bell at 8:40. At the end of the day, there is also outdoor supervision to assist with prompt and safe dismissal between 3:00 and 3:15 p.m. Supervising staff wear brightly coloured vests so that they are visible to our students. We always ask parents to remain outdoors at bell time, as the hallways are busy and congested at entry and exit times. And for our students, entering and leaving the school on their own is an important life skill that fosters independence and confidence. This applies to our Kindergarteners as well!! Select a "meeting place" to greet your child at the end of the day, and remind them (staff have done this as well) to stay close to a supervising staff member until they have made direct eye contact with you.



If arriving late to the school, you know that you must now use the front doors only. Our doors are locked shortly after the 8:40 bell, since "supervision" ends, and teachers are now involved with their students getting them into class. Please observe the posted signs at the front door that direct visitors and parents to start their visit to the school by first reporting to the office. If you are dropping your child at the school mid-day, we can make sure that they get directly and safely to class. Parents that are staying within the school, and travelling within the hallways – even for a short time - are expected to sign in as a visitor, and to put on an identification badge. This allows staff and students to recognize you as a "safe" visitor who has checked in at the office. Board personnel, and even contractors are also expected to sign in at the school when working on school premises! Please understand that it is for everyone's safety and security that parents do not travel within the school without following this important protocol. Thank-you for your understanding and co-operation.

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


Mmmmmmmmmm... PIZZA! Beginning on Thursday, November 6th, Mount Albion will be starting their regular Pizza Days!


