MR. BRADLEY SAID ...

It has been an amazing experience coming back to Norwood Park School. I had the privilege of being a student here in the 70s! The school has changed tremendously since then. When I attended it was pretty much a middle school (15 classes, each with 35-40 students in Grades 6-8). Now there are more classes in the primary division and all the students are in French Immersion. Nonetheless, it is still a great place for students to learn!

RESPECTFUL USE OF TECHNOLOGY

Cell phones, iPads and other devices have tremendous potential as learning tools at school. On the flip side, they can also distract from learning and be used for inappropriate purposes (access adult content, cyber bullying, etc.).

At Norwood the staff recognizes that we need to teach our students to develop habits that demonstrate respectful use of technology.

Our student agendas read, "Electronic devices are to be kept locked in lockers at all times. Students are allowed to use phones/devices in the safe zone outside of the office with their teacher's permission, when required. The use of electronics in the classroom will be directed/supervised by the classroom teacher for educational purposes only. Electronic devices brought to school are the sole responsibility of the owner. Students who do not follow the policy will have their devices placed in the main office for the duration of the day. Repeat offenders will have their devices picked up, at the office, by a parent."

Please help your child maintain their focus on learning by not texting or calling them during the school day. If you must get a message to or speak with them, please call the office and our Office Administrators will be happy to help.

While texting or using SnapChat is easy, we also want our students to develop face-to-face social and communication skills. By setting the phones aside while at school, we allow our children to indulge in play and develop deeper friendships.

PICK-UP & DROP-OFF SAFETY

Thanks to all the parents and caregivers who have amended their routines to follow the posted no stopping and no parking signs around the school. Your diligence helps keep

all safe as they arrive and depart school. It might take an extra couple of minutes, but if it saves someone from injury it is time well invested.

Warren Avenue - This is the street that should be used for dropping off and picking up students. The area south of the school parking lot is reserved for buses and taxis, but the entire length of the street north of the parking lot is available for pick up and drop off.



Terrace Drive - the entire east (school) side of Terrace Drive is a no stopping, no parking zone. Please do not stop and drop your children off on the east side of Terrace. The street is narrow and the potential for accident is greatly increased when cars are stopped on both sides of the street. If you need to use Terrace Drive, please park facing south (towards Mohawk) on the west side of the street.

School Parking Lot - As the parking spaces are limited, the school parking lot is reserved for school staff only. Please do NOT drive into the parking lot to drop off your child. It is a busy location with moving cars and the potential for danger. If you are dropping off your child on Warren, please direct them to walk to the field on either side of the parking lot. It is NOT safe for children to access the playground or school by walking through the parking lot.

South Bend Road East - Another option is to drop off your child on South Bend between Terrace and Warren. The school board is investigating the possibility of installing a gate in the fence on South Bend. This would allow quicker access to the field.
