Just a reminder, in case of school closure, to listen to the **local radio / TV stations** (CHML, CKOC or K-lite FM, CHCH) for **all school closures**.

You can also check the HAMILTON-WENTWORTH DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD website (http://www.**HWDSB**.on.ca/) or their twitter account for up to date school closures.

Announcements are usually made by 7:00 am for a full day closure and 11:00 am for afternoon closures.

Please make sure your child is completely familiar with **your emergency closure arrangements** in case there is a closure during the day.

NOTE: ** If you, as parents, feel that weather conditions are becoming severe, please use your own good judgement as to whether or not you attempt to send your child to school.

Parents may, in inclement weather, pick up their children at the school at any time during the day.**

WINTER SAFETY

While it seems that Ol' Man Winter is napping at the moment, I'm sure he will awaken soon.

- ⇒ During the winter months, hall floors can be quite slippery, especially during entry times. Students need to wear boots outside and shoes inside at all times. Stocking feet could cause a fall, even on dry floors.
- ⇒ Remind your children to cross roadways and driveways carefully. They should not cut across our parking lots to get to a car. Please meet them and walk with them.
- ⇒ Keep an eye on your child's exposed skin when they come in from winter play. Watch for white, shiny areas which may be an early warning of frost bite.

STUDENTS ARRIVING LATE

- ♦ The playground is supervised from 8:00 am to 8:15 am and from 2:35 pm to 2:50 pm.
- ♦ Daily routines are important to establish at an early age.
- ♦ Children arriving at school late impacts negatively on their academic progress.
- It is the responsibility of both the parent and the student to ensure that they arrive at school on time daily.
- ♦ Students are to enter the school at 8:15 am **FROM THE BACK PLAYGROUND** when the bell rings.

- ♦ Classroom instruction begins at 8:15 am.
- It is very disruptive to the class when a student arrives late, as the teacher has already begun their classroom instruction.
- ♦ Students are considered late once the morning announcements have started at 8:23 am and therefore require a late slip from the office.

STAFF PARKING LOTS

Please do not use any of the staff parking lots between 8:00 am and 3:15 pm to pickup or drop off your students. Also, be sure to keep the corner of Skylark and Hummingbird Lane clear at 8:00 am and 2:35 pm to enable the bus to get up the street ... this is a "No Stopping" zone.

Please make sure that you obey all of the "No Stopping" and "No Parking" areas posted around the school, as the City By-law Officer frequently visits this area and if you are in violation of any of the regulations you will be ticketed.

BUS STUDENTS ...

If traveling by our school bus, please be at your pick up area 5 - 10 minutes prior to your scheduled pick-up time. It is not the responsibility of the bus driver to wait for late students and they may leave without you.

Also remember to be patient, as buses may occasionally be delayed due to winter travel.

SNOW CLEARING, SALTING AND SANDING

Staff from the Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board will clear, salt and / or sand the following areas:

- *The walkways from the City sidewalk to the school
- *The school steps
- *Ramps to schools and portables
- *An area outside of entrances and Fire Exit Doors
- *Fire Exit stairs and ramps

When there is an accumulation of 5 cm or more of snow, parking lots and sidewalks are plowed by approved

contractors arranged through Facilities Management.

General salting and sanding of the parking lot is also done by contracted staff prior to the commencement of the school day.

Head Caretakers may salt or sand isolated areas on the parking lot on an as needed basis.


Playgrounds will not be plowed or otherwise cleared.

Head Caretakers will check the condition of the grounds early in the morning and during the school day to sand and / or salt isolated slippery areas that may occur due to changing temperatures.

Students and parents should take extra caution when walking onto or leaving from school grounds.

Caution must also be taken when playing on school grounds when conditions are slippery.

Based on the weather and playground conditions, the Principal may decide to have students remain indoors during recess and lunch / nutrition breaks.


