## **TRAFFIC & PARKING AT PICK UP AND DROP OFF TIMES**

### **Dear Parents of Pauline Johnson Students**

Construction on our new classrooms will begin this spring as our school becomes bigger. Many parents and community members have voiced a concern about the amount of traffic congestion during pick up and drop off times.

### **Please be mindful of the following information:**

- 1) Please help our school bus arrivals and departures by honouring the drop off and pick up zones. If you are driving a car to drop your children off please do so from a location that doesn't impede our buses.
- 2) Do not park in **NO STOPPING** or **NO PARKING** areas.
- 3) For cars parking on the west side of Hummingbird Lane **please park in the correct direction.**
- 4) Drive and Park with extreme caution. We have nearly 500 students who need to get home safely.
- 5) I have asked our Hamilton Police Services Police Liaison officer Sarah Postuma and Hamilton By-Law Enforcement to assist in this process.

By the end of March, you'll receive a customized PIN code from your child's teacher. Once you receive your PIN code, it's as easy as 1, 2, 3!

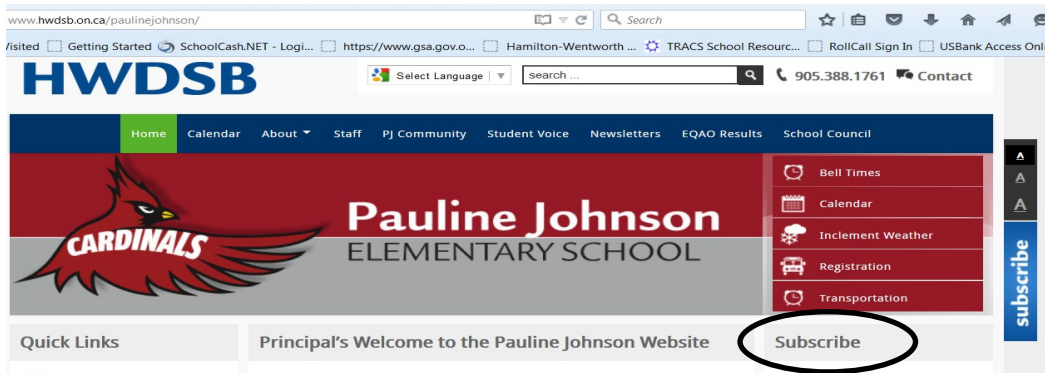

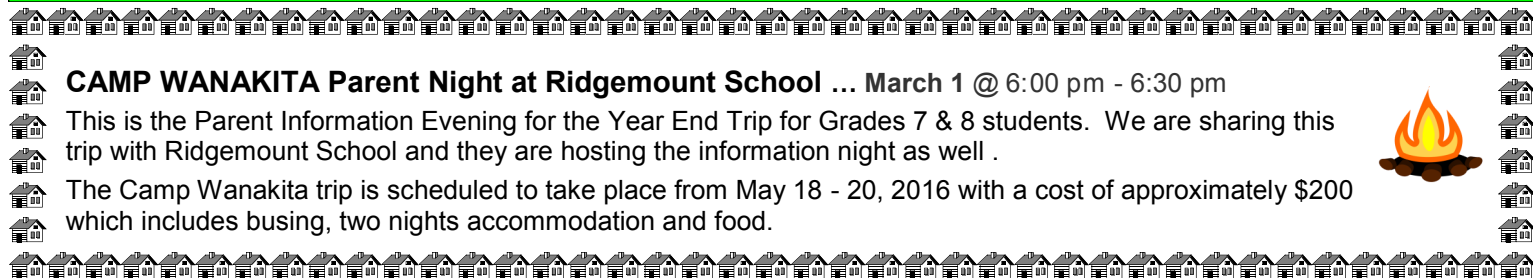

**LOST AND FOUND:**

Please be sure to have your children check the lost and found regularly to see if any of the items belong to them.

**TOBACCO CONTROL ACT**

A reminder to parents and guardians that it is illegal to smoke on school property. 'No Smoking' signs are posted at all entrances to the school.

**ELECTRONIC CIGARETTES ACT**

Beginning January 1, 2016, the Act makes it illegal to use e-cigarettes (vapes) in non-smoking areas including:

- ⇒ A school (including school property)
- ⇒ An enclosed public place
- ⇒ A day nursery within the meaning of the Day Nurseries Act (including outdoor area used by the children)
- ⇒ Child care centre within the meaning of the Child Care and Early Years Act (including outdoor area used by the children)
- ⇒ An enclosed workplace
- ⇒ Within 20 metres of any point of the perimeter of a children's playground where the public is permitted
- ⇒ Within 20 metres of any point of the perimeter of a sporting area where the public is permitted

As with tobacco, supplying or selling e-cigarettes and component parts (e.g. battery, atomizer, liquid) to anyone under the age of 19 is illegal.

**STUDENTS ARRIVING LATE**

- ◇ The playground is supervised from 8:00 am to 8:15 am and from 2:35 pm to 2:50 pm.
- ◇ Daily routines are important to establish at an early age.
- ◇ Children arriving at school late impacts negatively on their academic progress.
- ◇ It is the responsibility of both parents and students to ensure that they arrive at school on time daily.
- ◇ Students are to enter the school at 8:15 am **FROM THE BACK PLAYGROUND** when the bell rings.
- ◇ Classroom instruction begins at 8:15 am.
- ◇ It is disruptive to the class when a student arrives late, as the teacher has already begun the classroom instruction.
- ◇ Students are considered late once the morning announcements have started at 8:23 am and therefore require a late slip from the office.



**STAFF PARKING LOTS**

Please do not use any of the staff parking lots between 8:00 am and 3:15 pm to pickup or drop off your students. Also, be sure to keep the corner of Skylark and Hummingbird Lane clear at 8:00 am and 2:35 pm to enable the bus to get up the street ... this is a "No Stopping" zone. Please make sure that you obey all of the "No Stopping" and "No Parking" areas posted around the school, as the City By-law Officer frequently visits this area and if you are in violation of any of the regulations you will be ticketed. hands out tickets

**BUS STUDENTS ...**

If traveling by our school bus, please be at your pick up area 5 - 10 minutes prior to your scheduled pick-up time. It is not the responsibility of the bus driver to wait for late students and they may leave without you. Also remember to be patient, as buses may occasionally be delayed due to winter travel.

**SNOW CLEARING, SALTING AND SANDING**

Staff from the Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board will clear, salt and / or sand the following areas:

- \*The walkways from the City sidewalk to the school
- \*The school steps
- \*Ramps to schools and portables
- \*An area outside of entrances and Fire Exit Doors
- \*Fire Exit stairs and ramps



When there is an accumulation of 5 cm or more of snow, parking lots and sidewalks are plowed by approved contractors arranged through Facilities Management.

General salting and sanding of the parking lot is also done by contracted staff prior to the commencement of the school day.

Head Caretakers may salt or sand isolated areas on the parking lot on an as needed basis.

Playgrounds will not be plowed or otherwise cleared.

Head Caretakers will check the condition of the grounds early in the morning and during the school day to sand and / or salt isolated slippery areas that may occur due to changing temperatures.

Students and parents should take extra caution when walking onto or leaving from school grounds.

Caution must also be taken when playing on school grounds when conditions are slippery.

Based on the weather and playground conditions, the Principal may decide to have students remain indoors during recess and lunch / nutrition breaks.

### Dental Health Bus

The dental health bus is a mobile outreach clinic that provides emergency dental services free of charge to residents of the City of Hamilton with limited finances and no form of dental coverage. Call 905-546-CITY (2489) for hours and locations.

### Special Supports Program – Dental and Dentures

If you have dental emergencies or require assistance with dentures, you can ask for Special Supports funding. You may get the Special Supports Program if you do not have any dental insurance, have low income, and live in the Hamilton area.

### Public Health Services Dental Clinic
