COMING TOGETHER AND MOVING INTO OUR NEW CLASSROOMS

On Monday, March 20th we all came together under one roof. We are slowly adjusting to our new arrangement and ask for your patience and understanding as we go through a few growing pains during this time of adjustment for everyone.

NEW OFFICE ASSISTANT:

Please welcome our new Office Assistant, Ms Sara Barrieau. Ms Barrieau is with us in the mornings to help us with our morning attendance.

AUTOMATED ATTENDANCE CALLS ... We want to remind everyone that it is extremely important that you call the school whenever your child is absent or if they are going to be late due to a medical appointment, etc.

Our automated attendance calls (for students with unexplained absences) has been in operation for 1 year now. These automated calls go home around 9:15 am in the morning to the homes of those students who are absent and no parental contact has been made with the school. This system is helping to ensure that all of our students are safe and we would like to thank all our parents for calling us to let us know where your children are when they have appointments or are home sick.

There have been a lot of colds and flu this year and we would like to thank you for calling in to let us know when your children are home sick. This helps keep our school attendance up to date and we know that your child is at home safe with you. Congratulations to all those who do a good job of getting to school on time even during the cold weather.

Reminder: Regular, punctual attendance will set your student up for the perfect learning condition.

TRAFFIC & PARKING AT PICK UP AND DROP OFF TIMES

Dear Parents of Pauline Johnson Students

Many parents and community members have voiced a concern about the amount of traffic congestion during pick up and drop off times.

Please be mindful of the following information:

- 1) Help to ensure our school buses arrive and departure on time by honouring the drop off and pick up zones.
- 2) When dropping off your child(ren) please do so from a location that does not impede our buses.
- 3) Do not park in the NO STOPPING or NO PARKING areas.
- 4) For cars parking on the west side of Hummingbird Lane please be sure to park in the correct direction.
- 5) Drive and Park with extreme caution. We have nearly 430 students who need to get home safely.
- 6) Our Hamilton Police Services Police Liaison officer and the Hamilton By-Law Enforcement will periodically stop by to assist us with this process.

STUDENTS ARRIVING LATE

- ♦ The playground is supervised from 8:00 am to 8:15 am and from 2:35 pm to 2:50 pm.
- ♦ Daily routines are important to establish at an early age.
- Children arriving at school late impacts negatively on their academic progress.
- ♦ It is the responsibility of both parents and students to ensure that they arrive at school on time daily.
- ♦ Students are to enter the school at 8:15 am **FROM THE BACK PLAYGROUND** when the bell rings.
- Classroom instruction begins at 8:15 am.
- It is disruptive to the class when a student arrives late, as the teacher has already begun the classroom instruction.
- Students are considered late once the morning announcements have started at 8:30 am and therefore require a late slip from the office.

PARKING / NO STOPPING ZONES

Please try not to use our staff parking lots between 8:00 am and 3:15 pm to pickup or drop off your students.

A reminder to keep the corner of Skylark and Hummingbird Lane clear at 8:00 am and 2:35 pm to enable the bus to get up the street ... this is a "**No Stopping**" zone.

Please make sure that you obey all of the "No Stopping" and "No Parking" areas posted around the school, as the City By-law Officer frequently visits this area and if you are in violation of any of the regulations you could be ticketed.

BUS STUDENTS ...

If traveling by an HWSTS school bus, please be at your pick up area 5 - 10 minutes prior to your scheduled pick-up time. It is not the responsibility of the bus driver to wait for late students and they may leave without you.

Remember to be patient, as buses may occasionally be delayed due to weather or traffic.

NO SMOKING POLICY

Reminder that there is **NO SMOKING** allowed anywhere on school property.


AFTER SCHOOL SCHOLARS


GRADE 8 INFORMATION

Information needed to complete the application include: Birth Certificate, Immunization Record, Health Card and Proof of Residence (Utility bill, Property Tax bill, etc).

FREE IMMUNIZATION CLINICS are provided by the Public Health and Community Services Department for families that do not have a family doctor. Call: 905.540.5250 to book an appointment at a clinic or to get more information

Also Please Remember ... To have your 4-6 year old child immunized with MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) and DPTP (diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, polio).

Once your child has received these vaccines, call Public Health and Community Services Department at 905.540.5250 to update their

records. .
