ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Regular attendance and punctuality are important habits to develop and are crucial employability skills.

Students who attend school on a regular basis and are on time will have a better opportunity to experience success.

When students are absent or late to class on a regular basis, they experience gaps in their understanding of the concepts taught and the student's learning is negatively influenced.

If there is a legitimate reason for your child's absence, lateness or early dismissal, we require you to enter this information in the **School Messenger app**, or on the **Website - schoolmessenger.ca** or you can enter the info by calling the **SafeArrivals** number **1-844-506-4350**. If you need any assistance with this please contact the office.

Teachers monitor student attendance and punctuality. If student absences or lateness continue to be unexplained, a letter will be sent home to the parents of the student indicating the concern.

Your support is appreciated in encouraging your child to attend school regularly and to be on time.

There have been a lot of colds and flu this year and we would like to thank you for using the **SafeArrival System** to let us know when your child(ren) are home sick. This helps to keep our school attendance up to date and it also assures us that your child is at home safe with you.

TRAFFIC & PARKING AT PICK UP AND DROP OFF TIMES

Dear Parents,

Many parents and community members have voiced a concern about the amount of traffic congestion during pick up and drop off times.

Please be mindful of the following information:

- 1) Help to ensure our school buses arrive and departure on time by honouring the drop off and pick up zones.
- 2) When dropping off your child(ren) please do so from a location that does not impede our buses.
- 3) Do not park in the NO STOPPING or NO PARKING areas.
- 4) For cars parking on the west side of Hummingbird Lane please be sure to park in the correct direction.
- 5) Drive and Park with extreme caution. We have nearly 400 students who need to get home safely.
- 6) Our Hamilton Police Services Police Liaison officer Jeremy Dinning and Hamilton By-Law Enforcement will periodically stop by to assist us with this process.





 Birth Certificate, Health card, Proof of Residence (which includes a Utility bill, Property Tax bill, etc) and Immunization record.

 FREE IMMUNIZATION CLINICS are provided by the Public Health and Community Services Department for families that do not have a family doctor.

 Call: 905.540.5250 to book an appointment at a clinic or to get more information about immunizations.

 ALSO PLEASE REMEMBER ... To have your 4 - 6 year old child immunized with the MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) and DPTP (diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, polio) shots.

 Once your child has received these vaccines, call Public Health and Community Services Department at 905.540.5250 to update their records .





SCHOOL CASH ON-LINE

For safety and efficiency reasons, HWDSB would like to reduce the amount of cash and checks received by our schools. Please join the thousands of parents who have already registered and are enjoying the convenience of paying online. It takes less than five minutes to register.

Please follow the step-by-step instructions to begin receiving email notifications regarding upcoming events involving your child(ren).

NOTE: If you require assistance, select the "SUPPORT" option at the top right hand corner of the screen.

STEP 1: Register

- ⇒ If you have not registered, please go to the School Cash Online home page <u>https://hwdsb.schoolcashonline.com</u> and select the "Get Started Today" option.
- \Rightarrow Complete each of the 3 Registration Steps
- ⇒ *For security reasons your **password** requires eight characters, one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter and a number.

STEP 2: Confirmation Email

- \Rightarrow A registration confirmation email will be forwarded to you.
- \Rightarrow Click on the link provided inside the email to confirm your email and School Cash Online account.
- ⇒ The confirmation link will open the School Cash Online site prompting you to sign into your account. Use your email address and password just created with your account.

STEP 3: Find Student

This step will connect your children to your account.

- ⇒ Verify the School Board Name ... Select the School Name ... Enter Your Child's First Name, Last Name and Date of Birth.
- \Rightarrow Select "Continue" ... On the next page confirm that you are related to the child ... check in the Agree box and select "Continue" Your child has been added to your account.

STEP 4: View Items or Add Another Student

If you have more children,

- \Rightarrow Select "Add Another Student" and ... repeat the steps above.
- \Rightarrow Eight (8) children can be added to one parent account.

If you do not wish to add additional children ... select "View Items For Students" option for a list of available items for purchase.

Payment Methods: Three (3) Online Options

Option 1: myWallet

An online wallet that can be loaded to hold funds and pay for items on School Cash Online.

- * myWallet eliminates the need to enter payment information multiple times.
- * Simply sign into your account ... and select the myWallet tab.
- * Click Add Funds to myWallet ... and use an eCheque to load funds into your account.
- * Once the funds are available ... add all items into your shopping cart and
- * Select the myWallet payment method in your checkout options.

Option 2: eCheque

- This is an electronic version of a paper cheque used to make payments online.
- ♦ Anyone with a chequing/ savings account can pay by eCheque through School Cash Online.
- To pay with an eCheque, simply enter your routing and account number on the payment screen and click Submit.
- This option is best suited to families who do not incur bank transaction fees for each cheque/ withdrawal.

Option 3: Credit Cards

• Due to parent demand, we now accept payment by VISA or Mastercard.

ADDITIONAL INFO:

Families will still have the option to send cash or cheque for school-related expenses.
