Feeding Toddlers and Preschoolers

Feeding responsibilities change around one year of age. Your little one needs a more structured mealtime.

- * Provide a variety of healthy choices serving foods that your child can handle- small portions, suitable texture.
- * Offer new foods-a new food may need to be offered 10 or more times before it is accepted.
- * Set regular times for meals and healthy snacks. Toddlers have small stomachs and need 3 meals plus 2-3 snacks each day to grow well.
- * Serve meals and snacks at a table. Discourage eating while walking or playing and keep the setting pleasant without toys, TV and radio.
- * Let your child eat as much as he wants. Trust him. A healthy child will not starve by skipping the occasional meal. The next meal or snack is just a couple of hours

Crossing Guard

Queen Mary school is located in a very high traffic neighbourhood. Our students are reminded to always cross streets at stoplights or where crossing guards are located. Crossing guards are located at all major intersections in the area and they are there to ensure student safety.

Supervision and Entry

Staff supervision begins **15 minutes** before morning entry at **8:45 a.m.** Bus students are supervised until the arrival of their bus and the school playground is supervised until **3:35 p.m.** It is requested that students leave their homes to arrive as close as possible to 9:00 a.m. and return home promptly after school at 3:20 p.m.

Students must enter and exit the school through their assigned door. All students from grade 1-8 will be dismissed through a playground door. Bus students **only** will exit through the back doors of the school. All parents must wait outdoors for their child to be dismissed by the teacher. Parents may not meet their children in the front foyer or gather in the hallways.
