WEATHER



With the cooler weather fast approaching, please make sure your child is dressed for the weather conditions. Our students are outside during entry time and 20 minutes during outdoor break. Sometimes students will also be outside for short periods of time during Daily Physical Activity time. Students will stay inside if there is a cold weather alert (-15 degrees celcius or colder with the wind chill).

PARKING

If you driving your child to school, please park in the school parking lot as it is a safe walking route to the school playground. Cars coming around the bend are not easy to spot. To limit traffic at the school area, the school encourages students who are assigned to a bus to ride the bus to and from school and students within walking distance to walk to and from school, weather permitting.
