Principal

Caretaking update: Elle Howe has gone to another position within HWDSB. New caretaker to start March 23rd. Mr. Phau is now doing daytime caretaking.

Spending: All Chapters money has been spent. Books that were listed on the teachers wish lists have been purchased.

Staff will receive training on Thursday on the HWDSB concussion directive. A copy of the directive will be posted on Ramblings. Flow charts will be posted in school and will be implemented depending on physician

diagnosis. A return to school and activity process will be followed. Concussion history will also be followed.

5. Alex Johnstone – Trustee – with greetings from HWDSB

Concussion policy was discussed at the provincial level. Alex sat on this working group for the previous two years.

HWDSB is conducting a “Prom Project” and is looking for donations that can be used by high school students who are unable to afford prom attire. Donations of dresses, suits, ties, dress shirts, shoes, jewelry, etc. are welcome. On May 2nd, students will be assigned a personal shopper and will be fitted with prom attire. Three surveys are out right now for consultation: Parent Voice Survey (<http://www.hwdsb.on.ca/board/public-consultation/>) due February 27, 2015; Budget (<http://www.hwdsb.on.ca/board/budget/>); and Before and After School Care. All parents are encouraged to participate.

There are a total of eleven trustees on the board. Seven of these trustees were newly elected in the last election. Alex Johnstone has been elected Vice-Chair of the trustees by her peers. All trustees are committed to offering a system view of the board as opposed to a view of their riding only.

Director John Molley has been appointed as an Assisted Deputy Minister in the Ministry of Education (Provincial Government). HWDSB had appointed Wayne Joudrie as an interim director but unfortunately has been diagnosed with cancer and will be stepping down from this appointment. Pam Reinholdt has now been appointed to this position until recruitment is completed. It is expected that 4-6 months will be required for the recruitment process that began in January.

Embarking on strategic directions. Achievement matters, engagement matters and equity matters. Two rounds of engagement are expected; one in spring and one in fall.

Accommodation review. The accommodation review for Ancaster elementary schools and Queens Rangers has not yet been passed by board of trustees. Given the changes in the Director position, it is possible that accommodation reviews will be pushed back a year. All elementary schools in Ancaster are scheduled for accommodation review. This is meant to deal with issues such as schools that are over capacity, aging facilities, catchment boundaries, etc. Rousseau is not over capacity (currently at 75%). Out of catchment was closed at Rousseau previously due to implementation of the full day kindergarten program. Other elementary schools in Ancaster are over capacity. CH Bray in need of over 65% repair. When a school is on the list for accommodation review there are no repairs unless there are health and safety issues.

6. Mom to Mom Sale

The mom to mom sale has been cancelled due to lack of interest. This will be rescheduled for the fall.

7. Any Other Business

Stephanie G. suggested that we add a review of Action Items as a standing item on the agenda. Action Items will be summarized in a table at the end of the meeting minutes.

8. Fun Fair

The Fun Fair has been booked for June 12th. A quote has been received from Bouncers (this is the same service provider as last year). The cost will be \$1800 for 3 bouncers, water machine, snow cone machine, generators, and set up.

Natalie is getting the silent auction organized. Both donations for auction and volunteers to request donations from businesses are needed.

There will be no basket raffle this year.

Volunteers are needed to assist with set up; arts and crafts table; cookie decorating; face painting; etc. Kim

S. will put together a complete list of volunteers needed and this list will be posted on the school blog.

9. Other

The next mom's night out will take place on Monday March 9th at 8 pm at Kelseys in Meadowlands.
