Tips for Helping your Sherwood "Saint" at Home

Research suggests that this is the most impactful method for parents to be actively involved in helping students succeed. How can you help? (You're probably already doing it!)

- Support homework completion—ask your "Saint" when assignments are due, etc.
- Guidance on course selections—discuss and review option sheet choices (by-theway, each "Saint" is assigned to a Guid-

ance Counselor).

- Be aware of career planning and post-secondary prerequisite information to enable informed course selections (lots and lots of this information is available through the Guidance Office, ex. 225)
- Support your "Saint"
 to prepare for and
 participate on school
 teams, clubs and special events. This information is available

on the website, through school newsletters, in the student agenda and daily announcements in the school.

There is a plethora of activities that your "Saint" can join from Student Council to Repertoire (over 18 clubs plus Athletics). The school website lists activities under Community, Culture & Caring at Sherwood or try to view a copy of the Sherwood Yearbook in textbook or cd!



Parent-Student Events at Sherwood

While many secondary students won't admit it, they still appreciate it when their parents come to the school for events.

- You are welcome and encouraged to attend parent-teacher interview nights (1 each semester).
- Annual Awards Ceremony & Reception (November)

- Academic Nights such as Music Nights, Arts & Drama events
- Sporting Events

 (arena, pool, playing field, gymnasium, etc.)
- School Council where you can contribute to the effectiveness of the school community
- Graduation (June)

- Student Fundraising events such as Pasta Dinner and Coffee House
- Post-secondary information sessions each fall
