Have You Heard About Parent Assistant?

Parent Assistant is a module of the HWDSB's student information system called eSIS. It allows parents to log in through a website and view school information. Check it out!

Parent Assistant is a very handy tool to check your son or daughter's attendance; see how many credits your child has earned thus far; see how many credits are needed for graduation; and other general information. You can access your student's current schedule that may prove handy for making appointments.

Please obtain your password from the Guidance Office, photo ID is required. Then open your internet browser and go to the HWDSB website www.hwdsb.on.ca. Under the "Parents" tab, click on the "Parent Assistant" link. Using the information provided by Sherwood's Guidance office, enter your username and password. Click the "Log in" button. It's that simple! If you have multiple children at Sherwood, you must select the child

you wish to view.

NEXT YEAR during course selection time, you and your child can access "Courses" and choose the course for the coming school year. View diploma requirements in "Academic Progress" and tailor selections. You can add or delete courses as need be. (This information is timely and not always available.)

Keeping Our Kids Safe at School Act

New legislation that came into effect Feb. 1/10 is the latest step to help make Ontario's schools safer. This new law requires that all school staff report serious incidents that could lead to suspension or expulsion to their principal and that principals notify parents of victims when a student has been harmed. All staff who work directly with students must respond not only to serious incidents but also to inappropriate or disrespectful behaviour among students. This includes racist

or sexist comments, graffiti, vandalism, unacceptable behaviour and activities.

Everyone has a part to play in making and keeping schools safe. Ontario's Code of Conduct sets out clear standards for behaviour for students, parents/guardians, teachers, other staff, volunteers and community partners. The code applies on school property, school buses, and at schoolauthorized events.

If you observe changes in your son or daughter's behaviour that may indicate that your child has been bullied, please talk to them to gain more information. Speak with a teacher or Principal and teach your child to trust adults who can help stop the bullying which may be physical, verbal, social or electronic (cyber).

HWDSB Examines the Future of Secondary Schools

As of Feb. 22/10, Trustees decided to hold off the start of their accommodation review. Timelines and guidelines for the process are expected to be formally approved at a committee-of-the-whole meeting Mar. 8/10. Student enrolment is expected to decline sharply during the next 10 years. Three committees will examine enrolment, the quality of facilities and access to spe-

cialty programs. The committees will make recommendations to trustees on how best to use available resources to meet the educational needs of students.

Sherwood is part of the Secondary Accommodation Review Committee (ARC) South along with Barton, Hill Park, Mountain and Sir Allan MacNab. A minimum of four public meetings are to be held by each of the

ARCs. Near the end of the process, each committee will make its recommendations to trustees. The Board will then look at the options and invite public presentations before a decision is made.

Sherwood's New &

In order to establish a consistent process to address repeated late student work, a "request for extension" form has been developed at Sherwood. The student must complete and return the signed extension form to the teacher providing a reason for the extension and outline how the student will complete the assignment. Students agree to submit the

assignment by the agreed upon extended due date or receive a mark of zero.

For Grade 11-12 courses, students are to complete the form a minimum of 24 hours

For Grade 11-12 courses, students are to complete the form a minimum of 24 hours prior to the assignment due date. For Grade 9-10 courses, students are to complete the form up to and including the day the assignment is due. Students are allowed TWO requests per

course for each semester.

The student must meet with the teacher and the teacher in consultation with the student, establishes a new due date. Forms are valid when signed by the student, parent/guardian (for students under 18 years) and teacher. Failure to complete and return the form results in a zero for the late assignment.
