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The purpose of the GPP class is to prepare and motivate students to provide leadership and peer assistance to others in school and the community. Students design and implement plans for contributing to their school, develop skills in communication, interpersonal relations, teamwork, and conflict management. They apply those skills in leadership and/or peer support roles. Students examine group dynamics and learn values of diversity within groups and communities. Students are placed according to their strengths and interests with a teacher in the school. The course requires students show utmost responsibility and self-discipline and requires students to be self-directed. Last semester we had 29 teachers who were willing to offer this unique opportunity to our students in over 50 different classes from multiple disciplines.

#### SECONDARY ACCOMMODATION REVIEW COMMITTEE

So much has happened with the HWDSB ARC's, and there has been no shortage of local media coverage during the process. The most recent updates were made public at the Committee of the Whole meeting held on February 13, 2012. Here the South ARC members came forward with their final review recommendations and presented them to the Board. From here, the next step is the School Trustees will take these recommendations and make their final decision based on all the information provided. Going forward these decisions will not only affect our kids now, but for generations to come. The report's so detailed it can't be compiled into this update however, the South ARC recommended options can be viewed in entirety at <a href="hwdsb.on.ca/arc/wp-">hwdsb.on.ca/arc/wp-</a> content/uploads/2012/02/ SouthARC\_Presentation\_CotW\_Feb13\_ 2012.pdf. The document includes detailed information on topics such as Capacity vs Enrolment Comparisons, maps of new recommended school catchments, plus charts showing estimated costs. The ARC presented a few concepts for the Trustees to consider, ALL concepts included building a new high school south of the Linc with a targeted opening date of September 2015. Some of the recommended hi-lights were: Concept B- Closing Sherwood and MacNab in June 2015, Mountain Secondary remaining open with additional programs being added. Concept C- Closing Hill Park, Mountain

and Sherwood in June 2015, Mountain Secondary program relocating to the newly built school. Concept D - Closing Barton and MacNab in June 2015, Mountain Secondary to remain open with additional appropriate programs being added. Concept E - Closing Mountain, Sherwood and MacNab in June 2015, The Mountain program would be relocated to the newly built school. An additional consideration was recommended to further enhance Concepts B, D & E: to engage the Westmount community about possibly relocat-

ing the self-paced program to
Hill Park. That school would
provide a central location for **ARC**the self-paced program, while

the Westmount site is ideally situated to service the students residing on the west mountain. Among others, additional recommendations asked were: that all schools remain open until the new school is ready for occupancy in 2015, regarding Mountain Secondary options which propose it closing, they want the Board to create a committee post-ARC comprised of various members to inform direction around transition, programs, facilities, and supports necessary for the success of those students, there be an equitable distribution of athletic programs, programs of choice & SHSMs across the cluster and if they offer programs of choice across the cluster then they need to provide transportation equitably to all students.
