Parent-Teacher Interviews

Parent-teacher interviews are opportunities for parents and teachers to talk together about how to help each child succeed in school. They are very short so it's important to prepare to make best use of that short time. If you need more time, please schedule another appointment.

Prepare by reading the preliminary report. Talk to your son or daughter about the report and make a list of your questions and concerns. Parent-teacher interviews are strictly confidential.

You may share personal information that might be affecting your child's progress or behaviour. This information will help the teacher understand your child better. Find out what your son/daughter does well or what skills still need to be developed. Ask about homework expectations and how you can help at home. Find out from the teacher what method is preferred to establish and maintain ongoing communication.

Please share the positive things the teacher said about

your son/daughter and talk about how you and the teacher are going to help with the things that need to be improved.



What is Floorball and Have You Heard Who is Going to Finland?

Floorball is an exciting new indoor game that began in early 1980s in Scandinavia. Since then it has spread to over 48 countries with more than 3 million players.

This fast-paced game is simple—the object is to score in the opponent's goal using the Floorball stick and ball. Floorball goalies don't have a stick and defend the net on their knees. No physical contact is allowed and players may not raise their stick above their waist. Skill and technique are more important than strength and intimidation.

Proposed 2009/10 School Year Calendar

Every year, school boards across Ontario must submit school year calendars to the Ministry of Education. According to Regulation 304, school boards must design a school year calendar to include 194 instructional days (including PA Days) between September 1-June 30 each year.

Traditionally, the school year has commenced on the

Tuesday following Labour Day. For 2009/10 there are only 192 possible instructional days between the Tuesday following Labour Day and June 30, 2010. Currently HWDSB is involved in the process of designing its calendar for the 2009/10 school year. THE DRAFT CALENDAR PRO-POSES TO BEGIN THE NEW ACADEMIC YEAR ON

SEPTEMBER 1, 2009.

This draft calendar will be available for input beginning Feb.24/09 through the Board website at www.hwdsb.on.ca or info@hwdsb.on.ca until March 31/09. Based on input, the calendar will then be finalized by Trustees and submitted for approval to the Ministry of Education.
