

EQAO


Between May 23rd and June 6th, EQAO primary assessment will be administered across Ontario to all Grade 3 students. The assessment will be broken down into three academic areas: reading, writing, and math. Grade 3 parents will receive school specific information later in May regarding this year's assessment at *Sir Isaac Brock*.

The following information is taken from Parents' Guide found on the EQAO (Education Quality and Accountability Office) website (www.eqao.com):

What is being tested? The province-wide tests measure the reading, writing, and mathematics skills your child has learned by the end of the primary (Grade 3), according to the expectations of *The Ontario Curriculum*.

Do all students take the tests? All Grade 3 and 6 students in Ontario are tested; however, some students with special education needs and some English as a second language or English literacy development learners may receive accommodations or exemptions. The testing process allows students to receive the same accommodations as they would receive in their daily classroom activities.

What will the tests look like? Students complete three test booklets: one mathematics booklet, and two language booklets (reading and writing). The types of questions in the booklets will be familiar to your child, as they are based on work your child has been doing

When and where are the tests administered? In 2017, the tests will be administered in late May, early June. Your child's school will choose the exact dates and times so that the test fits into your child's class and school routines. The tests are administered by your child's teacher in the regular classroom.

Will I receive my child's results? Yes, you will receive an Individual Student Report early in the fall of 2017 that will show your child's achievement as defined in *The Ontario Curriculum*.

What will the EQAO results tell me? EQAO results are a snapshot of your child's achievement in relation to the provincial standard, and are an objective, reliable indicator of how well your child is meeting the reading, writing, and math expectations defined in *The Ontario Curriculum*.

Victoria Day Long Weekend!



Read All About It!

Many parents ask "How can I help my child to become a better reader?" . There are a few simple steps:

- Make time everyday to read together. Twenty (20) minutes can make a world of difference. In the early, years this maybe you reading to your child or your child reading a page and you read a page and, eventually you will have a chance to listen as your child tells you the story.
- Make this time a time to connect with your child. Life is so busy these days, it is a great time to snuggle up and read together and you never know what you will learn from the book that is chosen or what your child may share.
- Talk about what you are reading. Have your child tell you what they think will happen in the story before you read together. If your child stumbles on a word help them sound it out or ask "Does that sound right?" or "Does that make sense?" Ask your child about the problem in the story and how it was solved. Have your child tell you the main points of the story and maybe their favourite part.
- Have fun!
