A poll was done looking for consensus on spending goals, via email due to a concern of potentially not having quorum. The following was proposed and voted on by 11 voting members:

- Hydration Stations \$4,000 Kabob sales at the school will provide additional funds to support the hydration stations.
- FDK pen enhancements \$1000 not sure how much they will need without firm numbers but this should help
- French Performers \$660 (reduce to \$660 if funds needed elsewhere)
- Additional Books per Sajah's suggestion \$250

That's a total of \$5,910

Vote approved via email with 11 votes plus 2 additional votes at this meeting.
