Spencer Valley's Code of Conduct

Every member of our school community has a right to enjoy a school life without fear or disruption. Each should expect freedom from harassment of a social, physical or emotional nature. Our code reflects the expectations that the Spencer Valley learning community will demonstrate respect, civility and responsible citizenship within a safe environment.

RIGHTS

Students' Rights

Each student has a right to:

- academic opportunities that maximize the academic and personal potential of each student
- a safe, happy and productive environment
- freedom from verbal or physical abuse
- fair, consistent and just treatment
- an education appropriate to the learning needs of the individual
- Support, for social and emotional concerns

Parents' Rights

Parents have the right to expect:

- the school environment will be challenging, safe and free from disruptive behaviour
- good communication concerning pupil progress and informative records of student achievement
- their children will be treated in the same manner in which they are expected to behave
- notification of any serious matter concerning their child's school life

Teachers' Rights

In performing their duties, teachers have a right to expect:

- support for orderly behaviour at school
- respect and co-operation from students and colleagues at school and parents at home
- meetings with any parties important to resolving teaching and learning concerns
- students be prepared for class



RESPONSIBILITIES

Student Responsibilities

To help protect your rights students need to:

- come to school prepared, on time and ready to learn
- strive to achieve your best academic performance
- respect the ethnic, religious, gender, intellectual and physical differences of others
- attend school regularly
- dress tastefully in clothing which is inoffensive to others
- be a willing participant and demonstrate responsibility for your own learning
- co-operate with both staff and peers and take responsibility for your own actions
- complete and hand in all work as assigned
- refrain from bringing anything to school that may compromise the safety of others

Parent Responsibilities

To maximize your child's educational opportunities, parents will need to:

- encourage your child to work to the best of their ability academically and socially
- ensure regular school attendance. Notify the school when your child will be absent or late
- instill respect for the rights of others and for public and personal property
- demonstrate interest in your child's school life and activities
- share openly with staff, information which is helpful to the school regarding the emotional or social concerns of your child

Teacher Responsibilities

As the professionals in the school community, teachers shall:

- plan and conduct effective learning experiences for all students in their charge
- be sensitive and responsive to the behavioural needs of all students
- demonstrate caring, consistency and fairness in dealing with all students
- involve parents and support personnel in meeting student needs of either a behavioural or academic nature
- model appropriateness for students
- maintain a safe environment for all students
