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EQAO Update

As we look ahead to the Spring and warmer weather, please note the following dates for the EQAO Primary and Junior Assessments. These assessments, for Grade Three and Grade Six students, will be administered from May 23rd - June 5th, 2017. Parents, please be mindful of our testing dates to ensure your child's daily attendance.

Yearly, after each assessment, EQAO makes approximately half of the test items (questions) public. These booklets, as well as examples of the students' answers from the past five years are available on the EQAO website - Parent Resources

"A Guide to EQAO Assessment in Elementary School" is another resource available on the EQAO website - Parent Resources. This guide, available in 21 languages, answers commonly asked questions such as "What is on the EQAO assessments? Do EQAO results count towards students' grades?".

Math, Reading and Writing are components on both the Primary and Junior Assessments. Here are some suggestions that you might find helpful in supporting your child's learning in Mathematics at home:



- Include your child in everyday activities that involve addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- Play games and do puzzles that require reasoning.
- Solve problems with your child and talk about the different steps in the solution.
- Have your child show you how he or she can solve problems in different ways (e.g., through sketches, charts, graphs, words, tallies).
- Let your child know that everyone can learn mathematics

VOLUNTEERING AT WESTWOOD

Volunteers play a very important role in our school. Our volunteers help enrich our students' educational experiences and bridge the gap between schools and our community. Volunteers can help out with our nutrition program, work directly with students and may help oversee activities for safety, guidance, regulation or direction. If you wish to volunteer in the school or on field trips, volunteer forms are available at the office and can also be accessed in the 'Quick Links' section of our school website. Vulnerable Sector Checks can be completed in person at the Hamilton Police Records Branch for located on 155 King William Street or can be completed online at www.hamiltonpolice.on.ca at a cost of \$35. All first time school volunteers must have a Vulnerable Sector Check within the last 6 months when submitting volunteer applications. Volunteers must provide a new Vulnerable Sector Check every three years and must sign an Offence Declaration Form every year. We recognize the cost of completing a Vulnerable Sector Check can be a barrier for some volunteers. If this is an issue, please contact the school office for support.
