- Are the boundaries suitable? Stonehenge Boundary- one side of the street will attend Ancaster Meadow school/opposite side will attend to the new school.
- Is a boundary change possible? What would it look like?



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5. Questions/Comments

Questions

- 1. Looking at the projected enrolment is the new school big enough?
 - Accommodation and Planning has applied to add four rooms.
 - Waiting to hear a response.
 - No guarantee
 - 4 additional rooms at a capacity of 23 each = an addition of 92 to the new school's capacity
- 2. Is the new school site plan built to accommodate future portables if required?
 - Yes
- 3. Will the new school site accommodate additional parking if portables are required?
 - My information is that the parking specifications identified in current architectural plans are above the required allotment by the City of Hamilton. The allotment would still meet requirements should 4 more classrooms be added to the scope of the project.
- 4. What about the "Green Space"?
 - The rural part of the current AM boundary (South of Garner Road) falls within several regulatory 'restrictions' in terms of the land's ability to generate new residential development. A large portion of this area does fall within the Provincially defined Green Belt area. This area also falls outside of the formal urban boundary for the City of Hamilton. So from this perspective, any development proposed would require formal urban boundary expansion and approved provincially. Lastly, these lands also fall under the Airport Employment Growth District, which I understand to be a City lead project to expand Hamilton's employment opportunities these lands are identified as industrial lands.
 - Despite all the above current regulatory 'restrictions', HWDSB staff would be apprised of any
 possible land changes through circulations and other forms of publicized notification. We would, as
 is our practice now, take the necessary measures to analysis the impacts on accommodations and
 respond accordingly.
- 5. Has parking at new school been addressed?
 - Superintendent has made a request for parking to be looked at.
 - There will be more parking than required by Hamilton By-Laws.
- 6. 2015 Projections- How accurate are we?
 - Growth of the school. Ancaster Meadow grows by approximately 75-100 annually.
 - These projections are a <u>snap-shot</u> in time- and also closely examined three-year averages



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- 7. Enrolment/New Building How do we compare to other areas?
 - Comparable to Binbrook
- 8. Out-of-Catchment Students
 - Ancaster Meadow is currently closed to OOC. Students that are currently attending as OOC students are not asked to leave. If any student moves during the school year, they are permitted to remain at Ancaster Meadow until June but then must register at their home school. There are approximately thirty OOC students currently enroled.
- 8.1 What if the OOC students are closer to the new school? Will they have to move?
 - Grades 7/8 may be permitted to stay and graduate at Ancaster Meadow- transportation may be an option. Superintendent and Executive Superintendent will review on an individual basis.
- 9. Are there plans for students who may find it difficult changing schools?
 - Transition meetings and activities will be planned
