Purpose of Boundary Review

- Allow community to have input on potential boundary adjustment between new CH Bray school, new school on Beverly Community Centre, new school on Greensville site and Sir William Osler
- June 2017 completion will allow staff to meet Ministry of Education anticipated deadline for capital priority application
 - Applications will include an addition for New School on Beverly Community
 Centre site and appropriate size for new CH Bray based on approved boundary



Recommendation A

That CH Bray, Fessenden, Queen's Rangers and Rousseau be closed pending the related Ministry of Education funding for two new JK-8 elementary schools on the CH Bray and Rousseau sites and to convert Ancaster Senior to a JK-8 facility.


New English boundaries identified in Map #1 titled - Ancaster Final Recommendation.

New French Immersion boundaries identified in Map #2 titled— Final Recommendation French Immersion Boundary.




Recommendation C


Recommendation D



Status Quo

- Approved May 29, 2017
- All Queen's Rangers students attend new CH Bray school
- CH Bray rebuild 564 pupil place K-8 school
- No change to boundaries of new schools on Beverly Community Centre Site and Greensville Site or Sir William Osler








Recommended Option

Queen's Rangers Students:


- Students residing north of Power Line Rd East and West attend new school on Beverly Community Centre
- Students residing on Power Line Rd East and West and south of Power Line Rd attend new CH Bray school



Recommended Option continued

Queen's Rangers Students:


- Students residing on Governors Rd, east of Binkley Rd, on Binkley Road north of Governors Rd and on Weirs Lane south of the rail line attend Sir William Osler
- Students residing south of Governors Rd, on east side of Binkley Rd area attend CH Bray



Recommended Option continued

New School on Beverly Community Centre Students:


- Students residing on Power Line Rd West and south of Power Line Rd attend new CH Bray school
- All other students will remain at New School on Beverly Community Centre
- Limited number of students in this area – would not change enrolment at either school

- There would not be any changes to new Greensville enrolment
- There will be a potential limited increase (0-5 students) at Sir William Osler due to boundary change



Recommended Option Capital Requirements

- CH Bray rebuild 495 pupil place K-8 school
- 6 classroom addition and kindergarten class retrofit proposed – 465 pupil place K-8 school for new school on Beverly Community Centre Site
- Funding applications would be submitted to Ministry of Education in Summer 2017
- Anticipated response from Ministry of Education in Fall/Winter 2017



Transportation

- Bussing will be available to eligible students as per HWDSB Transportation Policy
 - Students in kindergarten who reside more than 1 Km from their school will be eligible for transportation
 - Students in grades 1 to 8 who reside more than 1.6 Km from their school will be eligible for transportation
 - The scheduled length of time on a vehicle provided shall not exceed 60 minutes one way.



Rationale

- Improved learning environments for students
- Allows some students to attend a school in a rural community
- Why Power Line Road:
 - Power Line Road does not intersect a rural settlement area (Copetown, Jerseyville, Orkney)
 - Power Line road divides student equally to new facilities on Beverly Community Centre and CH Bray

HWDSB Recommended Option Implementation

- There will be no changes for the 2017/2018 from current boundaries
- HWDSB staff will be able to provide more information once there is a Ministry of Education response to funding applications
- After the funding announcement transition planning will begin. Transition planning will provide more information regarding timing of boundary changes
- Any implementation plan intends to reduce the number of transitions and keep families together within the same school
