

Dear Interested Student Trustee Candidates:

The process for determining the Student Trustees for the 2019-2020 Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board is in three parts:

1. Submission of Completed Application Form by Wednesday, March 20th, 2019 at 4pm
2. Student Trustee Election Candidate Q & A session will take place on Wednesday April 3rd, 2019 beginning at 3:30 pm at the Education Centre ***only Student Trustee candidates are invited to this session as it is being recorded***
3. Election of the new Student Trustees will take electronically this year from April 8 -12th – all students in grades 7 - 12 will have an opportunity to vote for their top 2 candidates – each school will submit a final ballot for their top 2 voted candidates as selected by the school population.

The new Student Trustees will be asked to attend the **Ontario Student Trustees' Association Conference in May 2019** along with the outgoing Student Trustees, Cameron Prosic and Tara Rezvan.

Please note that Student Trustees attend weekly meetings with the Board of Trustees on Monday nights from September to June. The length of time for these meetings vary, but generally start at 5 pm and end at 10 pm. Student Trustees also plan and attend monthly meetings for Student Senate and those meetings are generally held after school. Additionally, the Student Trustees are often asked to represent the student voice at special community events and provincial student conferences, and to be involved in select Board activities.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Your child has indicated an interest in running for the Student Trustee Position for the 2019-2020 School Year. For the first time student voting will be done electronically.

As part of the process a picture of each of the candidates along with a written statement and a video that shows them each answering a series of questions about the Student Trustee Role and their vision will be posted on the HWDSB website so that students can inform themselves before voting. When students are ready to vote, they will be directed to a secure website which requires their student ID and password to be able to vote.

HWDSB Communications and Community Engagement Department will be organizing the student photos and videos, and possibly contracting with an external company to bring in their video expertise. The photos and videos will remain on HWDSB website until no later than May 1st, 2019. The original files will be stored on secure servers and retained for a period of one year after the current year.

What will be shared with your consent?

Along with their picture, we intend to include student names and possibly a statement about their campaign. The videos will capture students' images, their voices and their ideas as they answer questions about the role. After the election, all photos and videos of candidates will be removed except for the newly elected Student Trustees. Their photos will remain on the Trustee page of the board website.

Are there any risks?

Yes. Once the photos and videos are posted on the board website they are open to the public. When posting online, there is always a risk that viewers will capture screen shots or make their own recording of the videos and share them online. When this happens, the materials are outside of the board's control.

What if I do not want my child to participate?

The role of Student Trustee involves a lot of media exposure. For example, YouTube videos of entire board of trustee meetings are posted online each week, and Student Trustees may appear in other YouTube videos on issues they wish to communicate to the student body. They may also be featured on board social media pages. It is a high profile role because Student Trustees represent all of the students in HWDSB and report back to them. If you or your child are uncomfortable with the electronic voting process then the role of Student Trustee is probably not the right role for your child.

What if I consent now but change my mind later?

If you change your mind after providing your consent and no longer want your child involved, please let us know. We will remove your child’s image and video from the website. Unfortunately, we cannot locate and remove copies if they were made by others and posted online and outside of the control of HWDSB.
