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1. What would the conversation look like for staff to contact the City to discuss safety concerns (walkability) if the building were to be on the SJAM school site?
 - Preliminary high-level discussions can occur but likely more detailed studies would need to take place to consider items such as traffic calming, cross-walks, etc.
 - Representatives from the City (LRT initiative, Planning and other related departments) would be consulted to further explore pedestrian travel safely to the site
 - Conversations would evolve through exploration at the Site Plan Approval phase where parking, loading layout, vehicular access and maneuvering are all addressed



2. What would the impact be on our current adult education services, if we were to add a community hub to the SJAM site with adult education services? What other internal services could be offered on that site?

- Historically, adult education represent approximately 250-300 students.
- Current Alt Ed sites include:
 - King William
 - James Street
 - Mohawk College
 - City Learning Centre
 - Mountain Learning Centre
 - Parkway Learning Centre



2. continued...What other internal services could be offered on that site?

- Suitable internal services and the Assessment Centre could be explored by staff upon Board of Trustees decision and direction



3. Have any external partners come forward expressing an interest in the SJAM site?

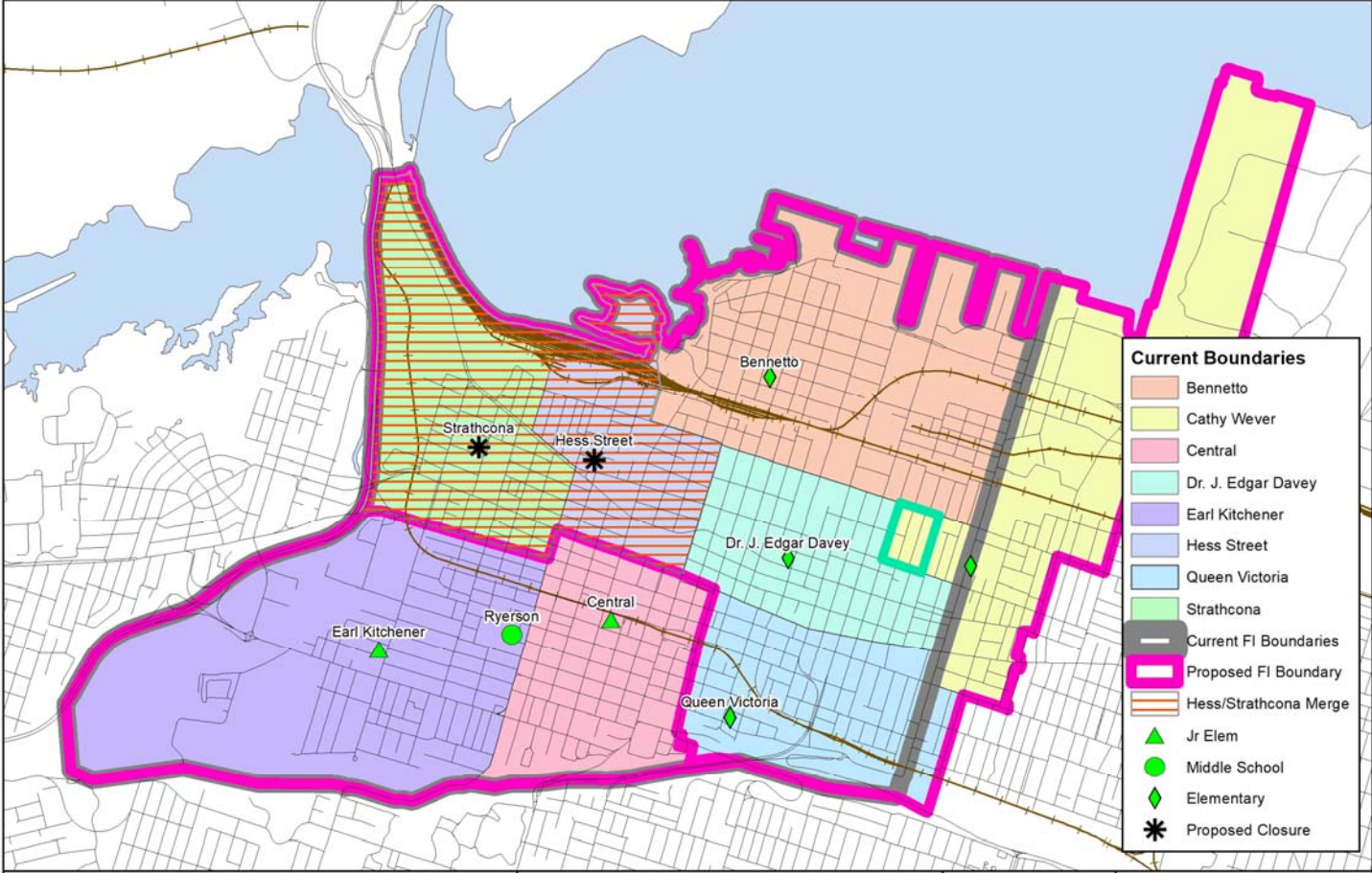
- There has been no formal expressions of interests as the SJAM site has not been declared surplus by the Board of Trustees
- The Hamilton Community Energy lease attached to the school would likely have interest in the outcome of the site.
- We can speculate that preferred agencies listed as per Reg.444 like the City of Hamilton or McMaster University may express interest (as well as others) as the location of SJAM is in a desirable downtown location
