3. Approval of the minutes	Proposed by Lisa Urban Seconded by Sue Zdero	
4. Business arising	<ul> <li>a. Guy Brown – Westdale transportation for extracurricular activities</li> <li>Superintendent Manny Figueiredo looked into late bus services and was informed that they do exist for extracurricular activities. If there is a consistent demand for a late bus, a request can be made to the school board. A bus costs \$12 000 - \$15 000 a year. A concern arose regarding budgets attributed for late bussing when the issue of grade 6 students who are required to take public transit continues. It did not seem fair that monies were being allocated to late service elective activities when a security concern persists. A clarification was made that not all extracurricular activities were volunteer and some activities were mandatory. For these students, there is no public transportation available whatsoever.</li> <li>b. Change to FI directive</li> <li>Trustee Todd White informed the group that in order to add a member, FIAC must advise Manny Figueiredo who will inform the board. FIAC is</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>entitled to 13 voting members. Currently FIAC has 12 voting members.</li> <li>c. Transforming Learning Everywhere</li> <li>Manny Figueiredo gave a presentation on the TLE program which is in</li> <li>Phase 1. Some concerns arose regarding the implementation of the</li> <li>program for the younger age group and discussed their concerns of</li> <li>monitoring screen time, adult content, BYOD, etc.</li> </ul>	

	Manny Figueiredo explained the board is working hard at evaluating the efficacy of integration and trying to approach the implementation gradually which comes with certain challenges. Comments and feedback are being noted and helping with the future development of the program.	
	d. Terms of reference	
	There will be one general directive for all advisory committees. Information that existed in the previous Terms of reference is present in the Directive. No information has been lost.	
3. New Business	a. Accommodation issue Lynda Newkirk brought to FIAC's attention, an overcrowding issue at Guy- Brown. Superintendent Manny Figueiredo and Trustee Penny Deathe explained that ARC does not need to be in place to study the situation for eventual situations. The Board is actively evaluating a short-term solution that will allow sufficient time to identify an effective long-term approach for the school.

b. Trustee ReportThe motion by FIAC to have the Program Committee evaluate the courtesy seats has been received positively. The program Committee will discuss the situation at their upcoming meeting February 12 <sup>th</sup> 3pm. Although Trustee Todd White will not be present during the Program Committee meeting, a report will be available for FIAC in April.
The motion by FIAC to provide more information regarding the estimated expense to add buses for grade 6, has been granted. This type of request requires human resources and time. Results of the revision will be presented at the next FIAC meeting.
c. Sherwood Transition Committee Both academic and applied programs will be available for FI students at Sherwood. Strings will be available if the demand exists. Parents would like more details about the renovation plans and schedule. There are currently 99 students projected to enrol. The Board is currently starting to map locations of incoming students in order to propose a transportation plan.
