- ➤ The team started a site in the HWDSB Commons which is accessible by students and enables them to converse among themselves.
- > Teachers are invited to two "coffee house" meetings running for sharing of ideas and information.
- The information gathering goes back to the students' home schools and the gifted team will work with their teachers to help with programming.
