
Recommended Action:

That the following recommended boundaries for the Ancaster, Dundas and Flamborough be approved:


Recommendation:

- A. That the boundary change between the new School on Beverly Community Centre Site and new C.H. Bray be approved as per Map #2 Recommendation A Power Line Road as Dividing Boundary Between New CH Bray and New School on Beverly Community Centre School.
- B. That the boundary change between the new School on Beverly Community Centre Site, new C.H. Bray and Sir William Osler be approved as per Map #3 Recommendation B Expansion of Sir William Osler Boundary to Include Part of Governors Road. South of Governors Road Attends New C.H. Bray.
- C. That the proposed boundary change between the new School on Beverly Community Centre Site and new C.H. Bray be approved as per Map #4 Recommendation C Power Line Road West as Dividing Boundary Between New School on Beverly Community and New CH Bray.

Current Queen's Rangers students attend:


New CH Bray School, if:

- Residing on either side of Power Line Road East and West between Lynden Road and end of Power Line Road East (Power Line address)
- Residing south of Power Line Road

New School on Beverly Community Centre Site, if:

 Residing north of Power Line Road East and West, but not on Power Line Road

Current Queen's Rangers students attend:

Sir William Osler, if:

- Residing on either side of Governors Road until entrance to Old Highway 99 off Governors Road
- Residing on Old Highway 99
- Residing on Old Governors Road
- Residing on Binkley Road north of Governors and south of closed access to Middletown Road
- Residing on Weirs Lane South of the Rail Line

Current Queen's Rangers students residing in the area recommended to attend Sir William Osler to be given the choice to attend the New School on Beverly Community Centre Site or attend Sir William Osler. All new students to this area will attend Sir William Osler.

New CH Bray School, if:


- Residing south of Governors Road, but not on Governors Road
- Residing on Binkley Road south of Governors Road
- Residing on Mineral Springs Road east of Slote Road

New School on Beverly Community Centre Site, if:

- Residing on Governors Road, west of entrance to Old Highway 99 off Governors Road
- Residing on Slote Road and North of Power Line Road East, but not on Power Line Road East

Note: students residing in the proposed Sir William Osler area may transition to the school as of September 2017, at parental discretion.

New students to area attend:

New CH Bray School, if:

- Residing on either side of Power Line Road West between Lynden Road and municipal boundary (Power Line Road West address)
- Residing south of Power Line Road West

New School on Beverly Community Centre Site, if:

 Residing north of Power Line Road West, west of Lynden Road but not on Power Line Road West

Current Beverly Central and Dr. John Seaton students residing in this area to be given the choice to attend the New School on Beverly Community Centre Site or attend new CH Bray school based on recommended boundary. All new students in this area will attend new CH Bray.

Rationale/Benefits:

<u>Part A – Final Recommendation – Power Line Road as Dividing Boundary Through Queen's Rangers for New School on Beverly Community Centre Site and New CH Bray</u>

- Allows for some students from Queen's Rangers to attend a community identified rural school
- Distributes students to allow for two JK-8 schools of appropriate size (New School on Beverly Community Centre Site – 465 OTG, New CH Bray – 495 OTG)
- Using Power Line Road does not divide any rural settlement areas such as Jerseyville, Copetown, Orkney or Lynden
- General proximity to each school was considered when choosing Power Line Road as the boundary
- Maximizes the utilization of the proposed 6 room addition for the New School on the Beverly Community Centre Site

Part B – Final Recommendation – Expansion of Sir William Osler Boundary to Include Governors Road. South of Governors Road attends new CH Bray

- Allows current Queen's Rangers students within close proximity to attend Sir William Osler
- In initial recommendation, it was suggested that only students east of Binkley Road and on Governors Road attend Sir William Osler. After consultation with the community, staff modified this boundary to extent west to include Old Highway 99, Old Governors Road and an extended portion of Governors Road. In addition, the boundary between Middletown Road and Binkley road was adjusted to accurately reflect the closed access between the two roads.

Part C – Final Recommendation – Power Line Road West as Dividing Boundary Through New School on Beverly Community and New CH Bray

 Creates a consistent and clear boundary (Power Line Road) between New School on Beverly Community Centre Site and New CH Bray

Size of New School at Beverly Community Centre Site

The recommended boundary change would add approximately 70-75 JK-8 students to the New School on Beverly Community Centre Site upon its completion. Due to the additional Queen's Rangers students and current enrolment at Beverly Central and Dr. Seaton the new school will require an addition of 6 classrooms and 1 FDK room retrofit.

The current design, as with any new development project, identifies a future classroom addition. The building and site design considers that addition.

Challenges to building beyond 6 room addition:

Any deviation from the existing floor plan and site plan would require additional effort and design, which would impact the current approvals process with the City, Ministry of Environment and Climate Change, and Ministry of Education.

The Site Plan Approval process (with the City of Hamilton) which began in June 2016, contains the information for the proposed addition. To revisit the addition, or floor plans would require a resubmission.

The current storm water management plan, which is part of the Site Plan design also only considers the future addition. Any changes to the floor plan would likely impact the storm water management plan and require recalculation and resubmission to the City and Ministry.

The current sewage water plan (septic) also considers only the base building and future addition. Any significant changes to the floor plan could impact the sewage plan on the site and require recalculation and resubmission to the City and Ministry of Environment.

With the above stated, and without a clear understanding of what could be revised, staff would expect an 18-24 month delay to the approvals process. Furthermore, additional consulting fees would be required to complete the revisions, based on a change in scope.

- The resulting boundary review is projected to create school enrolment at the New School on the Beverly Community Site of approximately 450 students.
- The resulting boundary review is projected to create a school enrolment at the New CH Bray school of approximately 475 students.
- There is no proposed change for Greensville's current boundary and therefore no change to enrolment
- There will be a limited increase at Sir William Osler due to boundary change, currently 5 students attending Queen's Rangers reside within the proposed area to attend Sir William Osler

Capital Requirements

Applications for funding to the Ministry of Education through the Capital Priorities Projects submission process would include:

- CH Bray rebuild 495 pupil place K-8 school
- New School on Beverly Community Centre Site 6 classroom addition and kindergarten class retrofit proposed to create a 465 pupil place K-8 school

Funding applications are due September 8, 2017 to the Ministry of Education.

Background:

On Monday May 30, 2016, Trustees approved the May 19, 2016, Finance and Facilities Committee report which advised staff to proceed with preparation for potential pupil accommodation reviews in 2016-17 for the following two areas: Ancaster and West Hamilton City (RESOLUTION #16-81).

On Monday November 14, 2016 Trustees approved the Ancaster – Pupil Accommodation Review – Initial Report (RESOLUTION #16-184) which initiated the accommodation review process for the following schools: Ancaster Senior, CH Bray, Fessenden, Queen's Rangers and Rousseau.

On Monday April 10, 2017 Trustees received the report which contained key feedback for Trustee consideration and three accommodation options created by the advisory committee. The report also described the public meetings and summarized the most common feedback from these meetings. As per the Pupil Accommodation Review Policy a public delegation meeting was scheduled for May 8, 2017. The delegations were advertised through letters home with students, HWDSB website, automated voice message and the newspaper. Members of the public were given until noon on May 8 to sign up for a delegation. 20 Ancaster delegates, 16 West Hamilton City delegates and 8 written correspondence were received by Trustees.

On Monday May 29, 2017 Trustees received a report which contained a final recommendation from staff. Trustees approved (RESOLUTION #16-81):

- A. That CH Bray, Fessenden, Queen's Rangers and Rousseau be closed pending the related Ministry of Education funding for two new JK-8 elementary schools on the CH Bray and Rousseau sites and to convert Ancaster Senior to a JK-8 facility. New English boundaries identified in Map #1 titled Ancaster Final Recommendation.
- B. That a new French Immersion program (grade 1-8) be created at Rousseau upon the completion of the Rousseau replacement school and that a boundary review be conducted.
- C. That a boundary review be undertaken between CH Bray replacement school (CH Bray and Queen's Rangers), New School on Beverly Community Centre site (Beverly Central and Dr. John Seaton), New School on the Greensville site (Greensville, Spencer Valley), and Sir William Osler to be completed in June 2017. Boundary identified in Map #3 titled Proposed Boundary Review.
- D. That HWDSB communicate with the City of Hamilton and all preferred agents identified in Ontario Regulation 444/98 in a timely and transparent manner to maximize the reuse of school property for community benefit.

Advisory Panel Meeting

The advisory panel meeting was held on Wednesday June 7, 2017. The advisory panel was made up of fourteen parents, five principals and four HWDSB Education Centre staff. Items discussed at the meeting were: the purpose of the boundary review, timelines, recommended option, and public meeting preparation. The advisory committee assisted staff by identifying concerns regarding the proposed option, long-term planning for parents, facility concerns and transition concerns.

The presentation, handout and minutes can be found on HWDSB's boundary review webpage for both the advisory panel and public meetings.

Community Consultation

A public meeting was held on June 13, 2017 at Ancaster High and had 26 community attendees. The meeting began with welcome and introductions which transitioned into a presentation from HWDSB staff. The presentation reviewed the boundary review timelines, completed Ancaster accommodation review and recommended option.

After the presentation, attendees were engaged in a survey to be completed on a supplied IPad or on their own device. The survey engaged attendees with questions regarding the current approved boundaries and recommended option. The recommended option was broken into 4 parts order to get specific feedback. The survey was completed by 26 respondents and the survey and results can be seen in Appendix-A.

Some of the most common feedback from the attendees included:

- A desire for all Queen's Rangers students to attend the New School on Beverly Community Centre site
- A desire for Power Line Road students to attend the New School on Beverly Community Centre site
- Rural families would like to attend a rural school
- Old Dundas Road area should attend Sir William Osler
- Consider flexible boundaries for parents that live on boundary lines
- Grandfather in existing students that attend Beverly Central/Dr. Seaton on Power Line Road West

In addition to the public meeting feedback, Trustees and staff have received several email correspondences from constituents regarding the boundary review. We received 13 letters of correspondence by June 15, 2017 at noon. These letters identified similar themes as those shared in the survey and verbally at the public meeting. The letters have been shared with Trustees in confidence to ensure individual letter writer privacy.

Next Steps

- Complete boundary review June 2017
- Apply for Ministry Capital Priorities funding based on boundary review Summer 2017
- Capital Priorities Funding response from Ministry Fall/Winter 2017
- French Immersion boundary review, approved by Trustees as part of Ancaster Accommodation Review decision, to be completed upon funding for new Rousseau school
- Secondary boundary consultation to align with proposed English boundaries, Winter 2018.
- Transition planning and information update pending Ministry of Education Capital Priorities funding allocation





The families affected by the change to Beverly boundaries ie south of Power Line should be grandfathered in


I live on Powerline Rd. I would like to see all families that live on Powerline Rd both East and west and north of that attend Beverly Central



If choices are being offered consider other boundaries to be a choice as well.


Existing boundaries for Beverly students should stay the same, it is only a few families so it won't affect the school number as much as it will affect the families
