



#### **Active and Sustainable Schools—School Travel**

Active & Sustainable School Transportation (ASST) emphasizes the importance of walking, cycling, and public transit. More students using ASST means less cars on the road, less pollution, improved safety, and increased physical activity. School Travel Planning (STP) is a community-based approach that aims to increase the number of children choosing ASST to get to and from school. Last year, City of Hamilton staff conducted an audit of our neighbourhood and co-developed an action plan with us. Work on crosswalks, installation of no- idling signs and bike racks, guaranteed fire-route access, and education and awareness about increased walking and biking to and from school were all recommended. Students were surveyed in classes and over 40% identified as being driven in cars to and from school each day.

# Yorkview School Council's Environmental Stewardship Committee


Yorkview School is inviting any interested parents to join our Environmental Stewardship Committee. The purpose of this community is to improve the natural environment around our school and promote health and well-being across our student population. We have two key initiatives identified to help us achieve these goals. One initiative is to begin implementing the action items from our Active and Sustainable School Transportation Plan. This would include working with community officials to promote active transportation to and from school like walking and cycling, as well as ensuring routes are safe and accessible.

Our other initiative is to work with the non-profit organization Green Ventures on a project where some of the old, cracked asphalt in our playground would be removed and replaced with a natural, outdoor learning environment. This is a very exciting community based project that will have a huge impact on Yorkview and our surrounding community! # **School Improvement Plan Update**

At our PA Day in December staff reviewed the Ministry of Education's Renewed Math Strategy and the HWDSB Vision of the Learner. The diagram below represents our model of the math learner in 2018. Three areas in particular are being targeted by HWDSB for professional development: Understands Math Concepts, Is Proficient with Facts, Skills, Procedures, and Engages in Mathematical Processes.



At Yorkview, we will participate in that system-wide learning and continue to support student well-being. Our staff are committed to work in grade teams to examine instructional practices in three areas:

- Ongoing formative assessment
- Anticipating student responses
- Noticing and naming the learning

We want to understand our learners even better as we develop differentiated instruction, small group instruction, and targeted independent practice. We believe a school-wide focus by staff working collaboratively is the best way to drill down to identify specific learning gaps in math. Staff meetings, PA Day sessions, and release time to meet with instructional coaches will be used to support our efforts.

You can support this work by asking staff what are your child's strengths and weaknesses in math. Knowing what strategies work best for your child will be important as you continue to provide support at home.
